

2003 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 13

January 28, 2003 – Introduced by Senators S. FITZGERALD, WELCH, A. LASEE, LAZICH, LEIBHAM, KANAVAS, PANZER and ZIEN, cosponsored by Representatives SUDER, J. FITZGERALD, ALBERS, BIES, GARD, GIELOW, GUNDERSON, GUNDRUM, HAHN, HINES, HUEBSCH, HUNDERTMARK, JESKEWITZ, KRAWCZYK, LADWIG, OWENS, PETROWSKI, STONE and WIECKERT. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1 **Relating to:** recognizing February 6 as Ronald Reagan Day in the state of
2 Wisconsin.

3 Whereas, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background,
4 worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good, having
5 been employed as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman, governor of
6 California, and President of the United States; and

7 Whereas, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction for 2 terms as the
8 40th President of the United States of America; the 2nd of which he earned the
9 confidence of three-fifths of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states
10 in the general election — a record unsurpassed in the history of American
11 presidential elections; and

12 Whereas, in 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated President, he
13 inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high
14 unemployment; and
