

**Whereas**, Saddam Hussein, on multiple occasions, has demonstrated a willingness to use weapons of mass destruction, including conventional, chemical, nuclear, and ballistic missile programs against neighboring nations, the citizens of Iraq, and innocent civilians throughout the world; and

**Whereas**, Saddam Hussein's clandestine weapons programs threaten global peace, the United States interests in the Persian Gulf, ~~and the continued stability of roughly 55% of the world's oil reserves~~; and

**Whereas**, the elimination of the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, particularly among states that sponsor terrorism, has been the principal goal of the United Nation Security Council; and

**Whereas**, making concessions to rogue nations like Iraq, which is in violation of United Nations Security Council Resolution 1441, will not ensure any regional security but rather will continue the precarious imperilment of the international community; and
