1	Relating to: commending the families and friends of those soldiers serving on active
2	duty in the Middle East and praying for the prompt and safe return of their
3	loved ones.
4	Whereas, Dictator Saddam Hussein's regime in Iraq continues to pose a
5	significant threat to United States interests; and
6	Whereas, Saddam Hussein, on multiple occasions, has demonstrated a
7	willingness to use weapons of mass destruction, including conventional, chemical,
8	nuclear, and ballistic missile programs against neighboring nations, the citizens of
9	Iraq, and innocent civilians throughout the world; and
10	Whereas, Saddam Hussein's clandestine weapons programs threaten global
11	peace and the United States interests in the Persian Gulf; and
12	Whereas, the elimination of the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction,
13	particularly among states that sponsor terrorism, has been the principal goal of the
14	United Nations Security Council; and

1	Whereas, making concessions to rogue nations like Iraq, which is in violation
2	of United Nations Security Council Resolution 1441, will not ensure any regional
3	security but rather will continue the precarious imperilment of the international
4	community; and
5	Whereas, military service requires great personal sacrifice for modest pay and
6	long periods of being away from family, friends, and community; and troops in the
7	Middle East will face harsh desert conditions; and
8	Whereas, those who enlist put their trust in the wisdom of our nation's leaders
9	and know that they could, at any time, give their lives for their country; and
10	Whereas, approximately 2,300 members of the Wisconsin army and air
11	national guard, constituting about 24% of the Wisconsin membership, have been
12	called to active duty as the United States mobilizes for war against Iraq; and
13	Whereas, this represents the largest percentage of Wisconsin army and air
14	national guard members that have been activated since 1961; now, therefore, be it
15	Resolved by the senate, That the Wisconsin senate expresses its support of
16	the men and women of the United States Armed Forces for their courage to remove
17	Saddam Hussein from power; and, be it further
18	Resolved, That the Wisconsin senate commends the families and friends of
19	those soldiers serving on active duty in the Middle East and prays for the prompt and
20	safe return of their loved ones; and, be it further
21	Resolved, That the senate chief clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution
22	to the immediate family of each of the Wisconsin residents mobilized for military
