#### Department of Health and Family Services 2003-2005 Biennial Budget Statutory Language Request August 1, 2002

#### Community Aids

#### **Current Language**

S.20.435(7)(o), the DHFS Federal Aids for Community Aids budget appropriation, specifies the federal funding sources that can be used in Community Aids.

S.46.40 directs the Department to distribute Community Aids funding.

Proposed Change

Revise s.20.435(4)(o) to include in the federal funding sources for Community Aids federal Medical Assistance funding claimed for Preventing Out-of-Home Care/Kinship Care Placement. Revise s.46.40 to direct the Department to use federal Medical Assistance funding claimed for costs for Preventing Out-of-Home Care/Kinship Care Placement as the first source of funding to meet the budgeted level of Title IV-E funding in Community Aids.

#### **Effect of Change**

The proposed change will help avoid or minimize a decrease in funding in the Community Aids federal IV-E budgeted level and will minimize the decrease in Title IV-E Income Augmentation funding due to new federal claiming policies.

#### Rationale for the Change

In October 2002 the federal government will be implementing a change in the claiming methodology for Title IV-E funds, "PA-01-02", that has a significant adverse fiscal consequence on Wisconsin. Department staff have projected that implementation of federal policy PA-01-02 will result in a reduction of \$13.88 million of federal IV-E funding on an annual basis for Wisconsin. The PA-01-02-related projected annual loss of \$13.88 million will result in a significant drop in the Title IV-E income augmentation program. Under state statutes (s.46.45 and s.46.46), 50% of federal IV-E income augmentation funds are distributed to non-Milwaukee counties.

The Department uses a methodology, known as the Random Moment Time Study (RMTS), as the basis for claiming federal foster care (IV-E) funding for administrative activities performed by county and state staff. In the spring of 2001, DHFS revised its RMTS survey, which is applied to county and state social service staff, to cover more fully MA as well as IV-E reimbursable administrative activities. The Department has been able to identify and claim increased federal

reimbursement for MA administrative activities performed by county social services staff primarily in the areas of kinship care placements for MA and prevention of out-of-home care.

To decrease the adverse effect on Community Aids funding of the change in federal IV-E claiming policy under PA 01-02, the Department is proposing a statutory language change to direct the Department to use in Community Aids the MA federal reimbursement for the costs for preventing out-of-home care/kinship care placement activities. Under the proposed statutory language change and the Department's procedures, the MA funding would be the first source of funding used to meet the budgeted level of Community Aids IV-E funding (\$27.8 million). Title IV-E funding would be used to meet the balance of the Community Aids IV-E budgeted level. As is current practice, any Title IV-E funding claimed by the Department in excess of the funding needed to meet the Community Aids and Milwaukee Child Welfare budgeted levels would be placed in the Income Augmentation program. This would help offset the sharp drop in Title IV-E Income Augmentation funding due to the implementation of federal policy PA-01-02.

# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES CHILDREN

Under current law, certain federal revenues are appropriated to DHFS for distribution to counties, as community aids, for social, mental health, developmental disabilities, and alcohol and other drug abuse services. This bill appropriates for distribution to counties, as community aids, all federal Medical Assistance (MA) moneys received in reimbursement of the cost of preventing out—of—home placements of children. The bill also directs DHFS to use those moneys as the first source of moneys used to meet the amount of the community aids allocation that is budgeted by DHFS for the costs of providing foster care and adoption assistance for children.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**SECTION 1.** 20.435 (7) (o) of the statutes is amended to read:

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20.435 (7) (o) Federal aid; community aids. All federal moneys received in amounts pursuant to allocation plans developed by the department for the provision or purchase of services authorized under par. (b); all federal moneys received as child welfare funds under 42 USC 620 to 626 as limited under s. 48.985; all federal temporary assistance for needy families moneys received under 42 USC 601 to 619 that are authorized to be used to purchase or provide social services under 42 USC 1397 to 1397e;  $\frac{\text{v}}{\text{and}}$  all unanticipated federal social services block grant funds received under 42 USC 1397 to 1397e, in accordance with s. 46.49 (2); and all federal moneys received under 42 USC 1396 to 1396v in reimbursement of the cost of preventing out-of-home placements of children, for distribution under s. 46.40. Disbursements from this appropriation may be made directly to counties for social and mental hygiene services under s. 46.03 (20) (b) or 46.031 or directly to counties in accordance with federal requirements for the disbursal of federal funds.

46.40 (1) (d) If the department receives any federal moneys under 42 USC 1396 to 1396v in reimbursement of the cost of preventing out-of-home placements of children, the department shall use those moneys as the first source of moneys used to meet the amount of the allocation under sub. (2) that is budgeted by the department for the costs of providing foster care and adoption assistance for children.

Comments on LRB-0116/1: MA Kinship Funding in Community Aids

Department staff have reviewed LRB-0116/1 on MA Kinship Funding in Community Aids and have the following suggested comments:

• Delete "that is budgeted by the department for the costs of providing foster care and adoption assistance for children." (lines 18-21) at the end of s.46.40 (1)(d).

Rationale: This clause is not suitable because the Department does not budget a specified amount within the Basic County Allocation for providing foster care and adoption assistance for children. (Counties other than Milwaukee are responsible for foster care and child welfare activities and can use BCA funding for this purpose. However, a specific part of the BCA is not budgeted for this purpose.) As the drafter points out, it is also awkward to direct that this MA funding source be used to meet a budgeted level of IV-E funding. To simplify the issue, Department staff have concluded that the statutory language should direct the Department to use the MA funding as the first source of funding to meet the budgeted federal funding level in Community Aids. This changes the implementation of the provision slightly, in that the MA funding would be used to meet shortfalls in the IV-E and non-IV-E sources of federal funding in Community Aids. However, this is consistent with the Department's intent to preserve the current level of Community Aids funding.
