Community Aids Funding

Current Language (2) (7)

Current statutes, s.46.40 and s.48.985(2), set the levels for Community Aids funding.

Proposed Change

Revise these provisions to conform to the funding levels in the Department's 2003-05 budget, as follows:

- --change the Basic County Allocation levels in s.46.40(2) not more than \$242,114,600 in each fiscal year.
 - (7) --change the Family Support level in s.46.40(7) to "not more than \$5,089,800 in each fiscal year."
 - --change the child welfare funding level in s.48.985(2) from "\$3,964,400" to "\$3,809,600".

Effect of Change

This change reflects the Department's projected funding levels for Community Aids in the 2003-05 biennium.

Rationale for the Change

The Department's 2003-05 biennial budget incorporates its projected funding for Community Aids as follows:

- Decreases federal Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) and Child Welfare Title IV-B funding to reflect the actual reductions in Wisconsin's federal grant awards in federal fiscal year (FFY) 02 and, in the case of Title IV-B funding, the projected reduction in FFY03 as well.
- Decreases the Basic County Allocation by the amount that is transferred from counties that are operational as Family Care Care Management Organization (CMO) sites. As a county comes on-line as a Family Care CMO county, a portion—up to 22%—of Community Aids

funding is transferred from the current Community Aids program to the Department for use in Family Care.
