Adding Food Stamps Administration to the MA Administration Appropriation

Current Language

The appropriation under s.20.435 (4)(bm) funds the state share of administrative contract costs for the Medical Assistance program, Badger Care program, Immunization Registry program, reimbursements to insurers, outreach activities, and resource center services. The appropriation under s.20.435 (4)(a) funds general program operations, including health care financing regulation, administration, field services, and medical assistance eligibility determination.

Proposed Change

Modify s.20.435 (4)(bm) to allow for the administrative contract costs of the Food Stamps program to be funded from this appropriation.

Effect of the Change

This change would allow for the Food Stamps program's administrative contract costs to be funded from appropriation s.20.435 (4) (bm).

Rationale for the Change

2002

In July 2003 the Food Stamps program was transferred to the Department from the Department of Workforce Development. When the program was transferred, the funding was transferred into appropriation 20.435 (4)(a). This appropriation is for general program operations. Much of the administrative funding for the Food Stamps program is used to contract with various vendors and agencies. Allowing the food stamp program's administrative contract costs to be funded from s.20.435 (4) (bm) would be more consistent with how other programs such as Badger Care and Medicaid is funded within the Department. Also, expenditures for contractual costs that are shared with Medicaid, such as CARES costs, would be funded from the same appropriation. Consolidating contractual administrative funding for MA and Food Stamps in the same appropriation facilitates Department program and fiscal oversight.

Thanks for the note. (4)(bm) is used for contracts with vendors (i.e., MA fiscal agent) and not so much was we think of as general state operations. The department has a contract with a vendor for the food stamps EBT program, hence their desire to have this funding placed in the contracts appropriation (4)(bm) and not (4)(a).

The language in Act 16 was requested by LFB, and not DOA/DHFS. If the request had come from the administration, my guess is that the funding for food stamps contracts would have been placed in (4)(bm). Why LFB didn't request the language in (4)(a) be modified, I'm not sure. I agree that there doesn't need to be any language in (4)(a) for general food stamps operations costs.

Hi Pam --

DHFS raised two points about this draft. First, on line 3 of the language, there is a reference to s. 49.179., which is a section that deals with fraud investigation. DHFS indicated that this should probably be s. 49.79 which is general food stamps administration, and this looks right to me.

Their second comment came with regards to the analysis section. There is a sentence that says:

"The administrative contract costs for MA and Badger Care are paid out of one general purpose revenue appropriation to DHFS, while the administrative contract costs for food stamps are paid out of a different general purpose revenue appropriation to DHFS for general program operations."

Are this underlined portions needed? To me it sounds strange to say the administrative costs are paid "to DHFS." Does an agency make a payment to itself? I think the point is that DHFS has two separate operations appropriations in program (4) -- one for Heath Care Financeing operations (4(a) for salary, etc.), and one for operations handled through contracts with outside vendors (4(bm).

Other than those two comments, this draft looks good.

FYI -- this is another one that will probably get switched to Erin Fath; I'll let you know.




