Change Appropriation 225 to a Continuing Appropriation

Current Language

s.20.435(2)(g)

Proposed Change

Amend s.20.435 (2) (g) to make the appropriation a continuing appropriation.

Effect of the Change

Appropriation 225 is currently an annual appropriation and will become a continuing appropriation.

Rationale for the Change

Annual appropriations are appropriations which are expendable only up to the amount shown in the schedule and only for the fiscal year for which made. In the last biennium, the statutory language governing appropriation (2) (g) was redrafted to allow the Department's institutions to provide certain services to other agencies as the need arose and to receive payment for those services. As revenue is received from agencies that purchase these services, it is deposited in the appropriation. To be able to use this revenue, the appropriation must have sufficient expenditure authority. If the appropriation remains an annual appropriation, it will be necessary to request additional expenditure authority through the s.16.515 process as revenues increase. If, however, the appropriation becomes a continuing appropriation, expenditures would be limited only by the amount of revenue available in the appropriation. By converting this appropriation to a continuing appropriation, it will be possible to use the revenue in the appropriation as needed without having to request an expenditure authority increase through the s.16.515 process each time revenue exceeds statutory limits.
