Appropriation for Interpreting Services

Current Language

GPR funding for the interpreting service fund is currently budgeted in GPR state operations budget appropriation for the Division of Supportive Living in DHFS under 20.435 (6)(a). The Service Fund provides funding for interpreting services and is used when no other source of payment is available. S. 46.295 governs the use of interpreting service funds budgeted in s. 20.435 (6)(a) and (6)(hs).

Proposed Change

Amend s. 20.435 (7)(d) and s. 46.295 to direct that GPR funding for the interpreting service fund be spent from (7)(d).

Effect of the Change

In its 2003-2005 biennial budget request DHFS is requesting the transfer of GPR interpreting services funding from s. 20.435 (6)(a) to (7)(d). The statutory change would enable the transferred interpreting service funds to be spent from appropriation (7)(d). The Department would continue to allocate existing funding in (7)(d) for telecommunication aid for the hearing impaired.

Rationale for the Change

Because the fund is used for consumers and not for the division's operating budget, it is appropriate to move the funds to an aids appropriation.

Hi Debora --

DHFS agrees that appropriation 20.435 (6)(hs) doesn't belong in program 6 and should be in 7. However, they wouldn't be able to do the file maintenance in the budget system, which means DOA would have to do it. My dilemma is having you make this statutory change now, and then having to make sure a new analyst does the FM later. This could easily be one of those minor technical things SBO forgets to do. So, what I would like to do is keep the draft the way it is for now, but then have the new analyst & Jenny make the decision later down the road. Hopefully this will ensure all changes that need to be made in the budget system are completed. Does this work for you?
