The department requests modification of statutory revisions related to its emergency management programs as outlined below:

1. Guard Members' Benefits: Tuition Grant Program

Request:

DMA requests statutory language changes to the tuition grant program:

Change to the statutes:

S. 21.49(3)(a) - Any eligible guard member upon satisfactory completion of a full-time or part-time course in a qualifying school is eligible for a tuition grant equal to 100% of the actual tuition charged by the school or 100% of the average tuition of the University of Wisconsin System for a comparable number of credits, whichever is less.

S. 21.49(1)(b)1. - The extension division and any campus of the University of Wisconsin System or a public institution of higher education under the Minnesota-Wisconsin student reciprocity agreement under s. 39.49 or an interstate agreement under s. 39.42.

S. 21.49(1)(b)2. - Any accredited institution of higher education located in this state, as defined in 20 USC 1002.

Discussion:

The requested changes will lower the maximum amount of tuition reimbursement from \$1,900 per semester to approximately \$1,600 and will eliminate, with the exception of Minnesota, out-of state schools from eligibility in the tuition grant program.

2. Sum Sufficient for Extended Emergency Management Liabilities

Request:

Create the following section:

- 20.465(3)(b) *Emergency management contingencies.* A sum sufficient to defray the costs incurred to reimburse local governmental units for the costs of worker's compensation, indemnification of tort liability and the destruction of equipment pursuant to §166.03(8)(f).

NOTE: A corresponding change to the statutory reference in §166.03(8)(f) would also be required.
