Topic: Eliminate Juvenile Boot Camp Program.

Current Language

Current language at §301.025, §938.02, §938.34, and §938.532 specifies that the Department shall provide a juvenile boot camp program for juveniles.

Proposed Change

Delete references to the operation of a juvenile boot camp program.

301.025 Division of juvenile corrections. The division of juvenile corrections shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of the department that relate to juvenile correctional services and institutions, juvenile offender review, aftercare, corrective sanctions, the juvenile boot camp program under s. 938.532, the serious juvenile offender program under s. 938.538 and youth aids.

938.02(15m) "Secured correctional facility" means a correctional institution operated or contracted for by the department of corrections or operated by the department of health and family services for holding in secure custody persons adjudged delinquent. "Secured correctional facility" includes the Mendota juvenile treatment center under s. 46.057, the facility at which the juvenile boot camp program s. 938.532 is operated and a facility authorized under s.938.533(3)(b), 938.538(4)(b) or 938.539(5).

938.34 (4n) Aftercare supervision. Subject to s. 938.532(3) and to any arrangement between the department and a county department regarding the provision of aftercare supervision for juveniles who have been released from a secured correctional facility, a secured child caring institution or a secured group home, designate one of the following to provide aftercare supervision for the juvenile following the juvenile's release from the secured correctional facility, secured child caring institution or secured group home:

§938.532 Juvenile boot camp program. (1) PROGRAM. From the appropriation under s. 20.410(3)(hm), the department shall provide a juvenile boot camp program for juveniles who have been placed under the supervision of the department under s.938.183, 938.34(4h) or (4m) or 938.357(4).

§938.532 (2) PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY. The department may place in the juvenile boot camp program any juvenile who has been placed under the supervision of the department under s. 938.183, 938.34(4h) or (4m) or 938.357(4).

§938.532 (3) AFTERCARE SUPERVISION. Notwithstanding s. 938.34(4n), a juvenile who has completed the juvenile boot camp program and who is released from a secured correctional

facility shall be placed under aftercare supervision administered by the department.

Effect of the Change

This change will delete the statutory requirement of the Department of Corrections to run a juvenile boot camp program.

Rationale for the Change

In March 2002, the Youth Leadership Training Center at Camp Douglas was closed by the Department due to a decreased juvenile correctional institution population, declining program enrollment, and the high cost per day of operating this program. A version of the program has been implemented at Lincoln Hills School (LHS) because of the statutory requirement to operate this program. If statutory language was changed, LHS would no longer be required to run the program.


