ISSUE/TOPIC:	Provide flexibility for nonpoint pollution abatement resources
PROPOSED CHANGE:	<p>The GPR appropriation for nonpoint source environmental aids (20.370(6)(aa)) contains a requirement that the Department allocate \$300,000 in each fiscal year for priority lakes projects. The Department proposes to eliminate this requirement and to change this appropriation from biennial to continuing.</p> <p><u>20.370(6)(aa) Environmental Aids; nonpoint source. As a continuing appropriation Biennially, the amounts in the schedule for grants and assistance under the nonpoint source water pollution abatement programs under s. 281.65. The department shall allocate \$300,000 in each fiscal year from this appropriation for grants under s. 281.65 (8) (em).</u></p>
EXPLANATORY NOTE:	<p>As a result of the shift of local aids administration for the nonpoint program from DNR to DATCP, this appropriation was reduced from \$4.4 million in FY 00 to \$883,600 in FY01. The budget repair bill further reduces this appropriation by \$44,200 to \$839,400. Of this amount, the Department must set aside \$300,00 for priority lakes projects. When initially established, this set-aside represented 6.8% of the total; now it represents 35.7%. Seventeen priority lakes projects exist with existing commitments for local assistance and cost-share of \$154,500 in 2004 and \$156,500 in 2005. Seven of these projects end by 2006 further reducing demand. In order to use all of the set-aside, these projects would have to increase cost-share commitments by 500%, which is very unlikely given existing staff. There are critical needs in other priority watershed projects for non-bondable practices that will go unmet if this set-aside restriction continues. This change will allow the Department to continue to provide for the needs in priority lakes projects and also fund other critical projects. In addition, the change from biennial to continuing will give the Department flexibility that is needed to make best use of the decreased funding.</p>

Under current law, DNR, in conjunction with DATCP and local governmental units, administers a program to provide financial assistance for measures to reduce water pollution from nonpoint (diffuse) sources. This bill changes the general program revenue appropriation for grants under this nonpoint source program from a biennial to a continuing appropriation. This bill also eliminates the requirement that DNR allocate \$300,000 in each fiscal year from this appropriation for grants for projects affecting lakes that have been designated as priority lakes.
