

OTHER EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL AGENCIES

Under current law, the Technology for Educational Achievement in Wisconsin (TEACH) Board, which is attached to DOA for administrative purposes, administers certain educational technology programs, including programs under which the TEACH Board awards educational technology block grants to school districts and juvenile secured correctional facilities; awards eflucational technology training and technical assistance grants to cooperative educational service agencies (CESAs) and to consortia of school districts, charter school sponsors, juvenile secured correctional facilities, public library boards, and CESAs; provides educational technology infrastructure financial assistance to school districts, charter school sponsors, and public library boards; and provides subsidized telecommunications access to various educational agencies. The TEACH Board is also required to promote the efficient, cost-effective procurement, installation, and maintenance of educational technology by school districts, CESAs, technical college districts, and the University of Wisconsin (UW) System, to enter into cooperative purchasing agreements under which school districts and CESAs may contract for educational technology training for their professional employees, to coordinate the purchasing of educational technology materials, supplies, equipment, and contractual services by DOA for school districts, CESAs, technical college districts, and the UW System, and to

purchase educational technology equipment for use by school districts, CESAs, and public educational institutions and to permit those entities to purchase or lease, with an option to purchase, that equipment from the TEACH Board.

This bill eliminates the TEACH Board and the position of executive director of the TEACH Board and transfers to DPI all of the TEACH Board's duties, assets and liabilities, positions and employees, other than the executive director, tangible personal property, contracts, rules and orders, and pending matters.





In section 23, appropriation 20.275(1)(js) should be recreated in DPI (as it was in the prior version of the draft.) This entire issue is in the courts right now so I want to leave the appropriation structure as is -- just in a different agency.

In section 9150 (1)(b), we are not moving all of the positions to DPI (only 2.0 FTE will transfer.) Can you remove the reference to "all positions" and accompanying language?



#### OTHER EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL AGENCIES

Under current law, the Technology for Educational Achievement in Wisconsin (TEACH) Board, which is attached to DOA for administrative purposes, administers certain educational technology programs, including programs under which the TEACH Board awards educational technology block grants to school districts and juvenile secured correctional facilities; awards educational technology training and technical assistance grants to cooperative educational service agencies (CESAs) and to consortia of school districts, charter school sponsors, juvenile secured correctional facilities, public library boards, and CESAs (consortia); provides educational technology infrastructure financial assistance to school districts, charter school sponsors, and public library boards; and provides subsidized telecommunications access to various educational agencies. The TEACH Board is also required to promote the efficient, cost-effective procurement, installation, and maintenance of educational technology by school districts, CESAs, technical college districts, and the University of Wisconsin (UW) System, to enter into cooperative purchasing agreements under which school districts and CESAs may contract for educational technology training for their professional employees, to coordinate the purchasing of educational technology materials, supplies, equipment, and contractual services by DOA for school districts, CESAs, technical college districts, and the UW System,

This bill eliminates the TEACH Board and the position of executive director of the TEACH Board and transfers to DPI all of the TEACH Board's duties, assets and liabilities, positions and employees, other than the executive director tangible personal property, contracts, rules and orders, and pending matters. The bill also eliminates the programs under which educational technology block grants are awarded to school districts and juvenile secured correctional facilities and educational technology training and technical assistance grants are awarded to CESAs and consortia and prohibits DPI from providing educational technology infrastructure financial assistance, other than forgiveness of annual debt service costs on loans previously provided, after the general effective date of the bill. In addition, the bill eliminates an annual grant of \$175,000 to the Racine Unified School District for training teachers and pupils in computers and eliminates certain obsolete appropriations relating to educational technology, including appropriation of general purpose revenues for distance education and educational technology grants, an appropriation of program revenues for grants to public libraries for the installation of high-speed Internet data lines, an appropriation of program revenues received from a settlement with Ameritech Wisconsin for educational technology block grants, and an appropriation of program revenues received from the Wisconsin Advanced Telecommunications Foundation for educational technology block grants.

Gordon: Please consider the following:

**SECTION 27.** I think the statement "forgive the repayment of loans" will work. We intend to share the next draft with Quarles & Brady LLP, who served as Bond Counsel for all of the TEACH wiring loans that have been made to date. While "forgive the repayment of loans" follows the statutory terminology, Quarles & Brady may offer some additional suggestions for this language.

**SECTION 76.** We understand now; thanks for the clarification.

**SECTION 79.** Even if Section 76 does become law, some additional bonding may be needed after the effective date to pay for disbursements under wiring loans that were entered into prior to the law changing. Since the TEACH wiring loan program is winding down, this amount would be very small, if any. Our preference would be do delete language that requires approval of the governor. This preference is due to (1) remaining bonding will be very small, and (2) the approval of governor adds extra steps to the issuance process and the approval of governor applies to only a couple of the borrowing purposes.

**SECTION 76.** Loan forgiveness could be construed as financial assistance. That is why I added the "except as provided in s. 115.999 (3m)" language to this SECTION.

**SECTION 79.** Should we repeal s. 44.72 (4) (d) in its entirety or just the language about securing the approval of the governor? If we repeal the provision in its entirety, that repeal might be construed to eliminate the authority of DPI to request the Building Commission to contract public debt. On the other hand, if under SECTION 76 no more financial assistance will be provided, will there even be a need to contract public debt?

Hi Gordon --

Our Capital Finance staffers have reviewed draft 666 (TEACH) and have made the following observations and/or requests for changes:

#### Section 27:

- (1) Re-order the items for which federal E-rate funding will be used so that it is consistent with the order in **Section 98**. (This order is (a) forgive debt service costs, (b) pay administrative expenses, and (3) reimburse the State for GPR debt service.)
- (2) The term "debt service costs" is used to identify the local payments being made on the wiring loans. This terminology could be confusing as the payments are actually lease payments and are paid from the school's general fund and are not paid from the school's debt fund. (On a related point, please note that the language in **Section 78** refers to "repayment of loans" and does not use the "debt service costs" terminology.)

#### Section 76:

New language at the end of this section refers to exceptions in proposed section 115.999(3m). Does section 115.999(3m) actually include any exceptions that would apply?

#### Section 79:

Delete section 44.72(4)(d) since it adds extra oversight of the governor when such oversight does not exist for other borrowing purposes. In addition, this would add extra steps for the issuance of obligations.

### Section 98:

- (1) Since the E-rate amount may not always be sufficient to cover all the local repayments, add the phrase "to the extent available" to the beginning of this section.
- (2) See note above for **Section 27** regarding the use of "debt service costs" terminology.
- (3) Change the reference to section 20.866(1)(u) to sections 20.555(4)(er) and (4)(es). The reference to 20.866(1)
- (u) addresses both state GPR debt service payments and amounts collected from local repayments, whereas this reference is intended to address only the state GPR debt service payments.
