Request Description:

- Specify that the rate per mile amounts in calendar year 2004 be \$1,871 and \$1,917 for calendar year 2005.
- Specify amounts to be used for aid calculations for calendar year 2004 and calendar year 2005.
 - Counties: CY04 \$92,295,700; CY05 \$94,603,100
 - Municipalities: CY04 \$293,373,400; CY05 \$297,632,700
- Delete references to rates and amounts for CY01, CY02 and CY03.
- Repeal statutory references regarding CY01 general transportation aid payments.

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

- 1. Amend s. 86.30(2)(a)3 Wis. Stats., to specify that the rate per mile is \$1,871 for CY 04 and \$1,917 for CY 05 and thereafter and delete references to the rate per mile for CY 01 and CY 02.
- 2. Specify the calendar year amounts to be used for aid calculations:
 - a. Amend s. 86.30(9)(b) Wis. Stats., to specify that the amount for counties in CY 04 is \$92,295,700 and \$94,603,100 for CY 05 and thereafter and delete references to amounts for CY 00, CY 01, and CY 02.
 - Amend s. 86.30(9)(c) Wis. Stats., to specify that the amount for municipalities in CY 04 is \$290,373,400 and \$297,632,700 in CY 05 and thereafter and delete references to amounts for CY 00, CY 01, and CY 02.
- 3. Repeal s. 86.30(10) Wis. Stats., regarding CY 01 GTA payments.

JUSTIFICATION:

The statutory changes requested above represent the Department's requested increases in GTA program funding to fully fund CY 03 GTA payments and provide CY inflationary increases of 2.5% in FY 04 and FY 05 as well as deletion of outdated provisions.

REQUEST:

The Department requests \$2,857,200 SEG in FY 04 and \$5,136,400 SEG in FY 05 for transportation aids to counties and \$8,989,100 SEG in FY 04 and \$16,159,900 SEG in FY 05 for general transportation aids to municipalities.

SUMMARY:

The General Transportation Aids (GTA) Program provides reimbursement funding to each of Wisconsin's 1,922 local governments to help defray a portion of the costs incurred for construction and maintenance of the local road and street system. The current, cost based GTA formula was implemented in 1988 and provides local governments with a stable source of funding for construction and maintenance of their local road system.

GTA is a reimbursement program based on each local government's spending history and is paid on a calendar year basis. The relationship between calendar year payments and fiscal year appropriations is one where the fiscal year appropriation includes payments for $\frac{1}{2}$ of the previous year and $\frac{1}{2}$ of the current year. For example, FY 04 = $\frac{1}{2}$ CY 03) + $\frac{1}{2}$ CY 04).

Payments to municipalities are based on either: (1) a share of eligible transportation-related expenditures (share-of-costs [SOC]); or (2) a rate-per-mile (RPM), whichever is greater. All payments to counties are based on a share of eligible transportation-related expenditures (SOC). The majority of GTA funds are distributed through SOC, although a larger number of local governments are paid through the RPM.

The SOC rate for counties and municipalities is determined by the available funding and the six-year average costs reported by each county or municipality. In CY 02, the funding level resulted in a SOC percentage of 25.8% for counties and 20.6% for municipalities. The Department uses transportation-related portions of the Department of Revenue's Financial Report Form to determine a local government's reimbursable costs.

The formula provides minimum and maximum cushions for communities under the SOC to prevent large swings in funding. Under the minimum cushion, counties cannot receive less than 98%, and municipalities less than 95%, of their prior year's payment. The maximum cushion limits payment increases to 115% of the prior year's payment. No municipality can receive payments that are higher than 85% of its three-year average costs and could result in a local government getting less than the statutory RPM (\$1,755 in CY 02, \$1,825 in CY 03).

JUSTIFICATION:

DOT's request represents the amounts necessary to fully fund CY 03 GTA payments and provide 2.5% inflationary increases on calendar year aids payments for FY 04 and FY 05.

Hi Benjamin,

I'm working on drafting request BB0281 regarding DOT general transportation aids, and have a couple of clarifying questions.

- 1. DOT's statutory modification sheet, in item 2.b., refers to aids to municipalities for CY 04 as "290,373,400", but your cover sheet uses the figure "293,373,400". Was this discrepancy intentional, i.e., which figure should I use in the draft?
- 2. DOT's stat mod sheet refers to deleting references to CY 00, CY 01, and CY 02 amounts, but your cover sheet specifies CY 01, CY 02, and CY 03. I assume you meant to include CY 00. With regard to CY 03, the budget bill will pass in CY 03, so CY 03 amounts definitely need to stay in the statutes. We have also often (but not always) left in the statutes the aid figures for at least one year back (here CY 02) so that it is easy for people who rely on these figures to determine what the aid amount was last year without having to go back to previous session laws. (See for example 2001 Act 16 section 2344 and 2345; 1999 Act 9 sections 1858, 1862, 1863.) Do you want the draft to delete references to amounts for CY 00, CY 01, and CY 02, or just for CY 00 and CY 01?


