**Title:** Require the department to pursue a federal waiver to expand MA managed care.

**Purpose of Draft:** This draft would create a non-statutory provision, requiring the Department of Health and Family Services to submit a federal Medical Assistance waiver request to the federal government, in order to implement mandatory managed care enrollment for MA participants who are eligible for supplemental security income.

Federal law requires the presence of at least two managed care organizations in a county (or other geographic region, as determined by the state) in order for the state to mandate MA recipients enroll in managed care plans. This waiver would request an exemption from this federal law.

#### MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

Under current federal law related to the federal Medical Assistance (MA) program (commonly known as "Medicaid"), a state may require recipients of MA to enroll in managed care plans only if at least two managed care organizations are present as providers in each of the state's geographic service regions. Also under grants to recipients who aged, blind, or disabled and have very low income and assets. are

This bill requires DHFS to request from the secretary of the federal Department of Health and Human Services a waiver of Medicaid laws in order to enable DHFS to require MA recipients who are recipients of SSI to enroll for MA services under managed care systems, including those MA recipients who are in a geographical service region that contains only a single managed care organization as service provider.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 9124. Nonstatutory provisions; health and family services.

(1) Medical Assistance managed care waiver request. The department of health and family services shall request from the secretary of the federal department of health and human services, under 42 USC 1396n (c), any waivers of federal Medical Assistance program laws necessary to authorize the department of health and family services to require that those recipients of Medical Assistance who are eligible for the Supplemental Security Income program under 42 USC 1382 to 1383f enroll for services in managed care plans, including recipients who are in a geographic service region that contains no more than a single managed care organization as service provider.

#### To Robert Blaine:

- 1. This bill sets no specific time for DHFS to request the waiver; if no specific time is set, the provision appears to be an ongoing requirement, which should be statutory, rather than nonstatutory.
- 2. You may wish to require DHFS to implement the waiver, if received (see, e.g., s. 49.45 (24r), stats.), although the department has broad powers to administer MA, and so, from a legal standpoint, it is not essential. If you do wish to require DHFS to implement the waiver, it would be necessary to draft this as a statutory, rather than nonstatutory, provision.
- 3. I have referred to the federal SSI program; do you wish, instead to refer to the SSI supplementary program under s. 49.77, stats.? Both?

#### Hi Debora!

Regarding your drafter's notes.

- 1. I see your point about not stating a specific time to submit this waiver. I think a time should be specified, since we are going to rely on this waiver for some savings in the MA program during the second year. Let's redraft to set a waiver submission dedline of January 1, 2004.
- 2. I do not think it's necessary to require DHFS to implement the waiver. I think there will be incentives in place that will compel such an action. Furthermore, in the event that the federal government approves a waiver, but one that is so restrictive that we cannot accomplish our goals, I don't want to force the implementation of such a waiver.
- 3. I think it's fine to refer to the federal SSI program. To qualify for the state supplement, you must qualify for the federal SSI payment, thus citing the federal program is more broad. Furthermore, qualification for the federal SSI is a factor in MA eligiblity (not the state payment), thus I think it makes sense to peg this provision to the federal payment.
