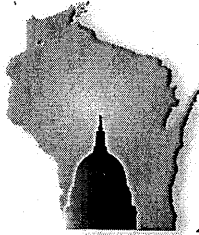

Please have the following item drafted for possible inclusion in the 2003-05 biennial budget bill:

2% option & low revenue limit - K12 financing. Provide school districts the option to increase their revenues under the revenue limit by 2%. Also increase the low revenue limit. Allow school districts to use the greater of these two changes.

*2% option*

- ✓ Allow a school district to increase its revenue limit per pupil, beginning in FY04, if the school board adopts a resolution approving the increase by a 2/3rds vote of the board's membership.
- ✓ Specify that the amount of the allowable increase would equal 2% of the current year's allowable revenue per pupil for the district prior to any non-recurring exemptions (thus each district will have a unique figure).
- ✓ This 2% option shall be a non-recurring exemption. A school board would need to annually adopt a resolution to carry this increase forward into subsequent years.
- ✓ Exclude all revenues raised from this 2% option from the definition of partial school revenues. *But 2/3 requirement eliminated, so ....*
- Include revenues raised from this 2% option in aidable costs. Consequently, districts that utilize this option will receive additional aid in the subsequent year (according to their entitlement under the school aid formula).

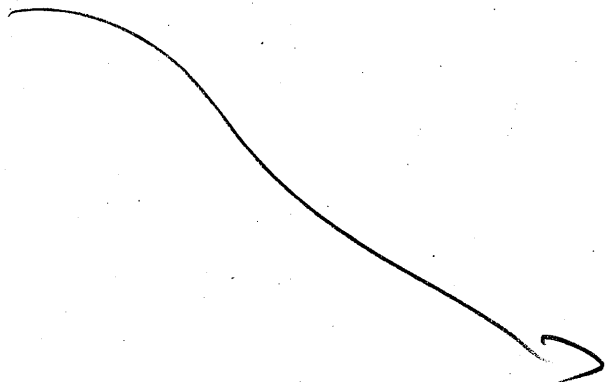
