The Governor wishes to present all of the Legislature's GPR funds in a one-time sum sufficient appropriation in 2003-05. This would be a new appropriation which would repeal on June 30, 2005. It would contain all recommended funds for the Assembly, Senate, service agencies, legislative documents, memberships, etc. The existing appropriations would remain in place with zeros for spending authority.

The intent is to provide a single sum of money each year for the legislature, with a reduction netted out, which it can then allocate back to the various appropriations as it sees fit. This avoids the Governor dictating to the Legislature where the dollar and position reductions should be taken in his bill.

I see us (DOA) leaving the positions in place where they are currently authorized in the state budget system and just consolidating the dollars.

***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

Current law provides for separate appropriations for the following legislative functions: general program operations of the assembly, general program operations of the senate, legislative documents, retirement committees, retirement actuarial studies, Revisor of Statutes Bureau, Legislative Reference Bureau, Legislative Audit Bureau, Legislative Fiscal Bureau, Joint Legislative Council, Legislative Technology Services Bureau, Joint Committee on Legislative Organization, membership in national associations, and capitol office relocation costs.

The bill provides, for the 2003-05 fiscal biennium, that all of these legislative functions are funded from a single, sum-sufficient appropriation, with funding levels for each function allocated by the Joint Committee on Legislative Organization.

For further information see the *state* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

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***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***
