

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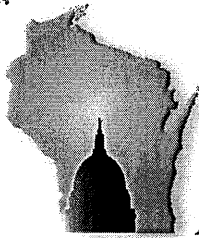

Please begin drafting the following:

- R* 1. Limit the growth in resident undergraduate tuition to \$700 per academic year at the Madison and Milwaukee campuses
- R* 2. Limit the growth in resident undergraduate tuition to \$500 per academic year at all other UW campuses
- B* 3. Establish two new PR appropriations within the UW chapter 20 schedule, (a) Wisconsin Higher Educational Grant – UW Students – Auxiliary Enterprises fund supplement, and (b) Lawton Minority Retention Grant – Auxiliary Enterprises fund supplement
- C* 4. Require the UW System to provide a nonresident tuition remission for certain undocumented persons (similar to item 55 page 1462 of the LFB summary of Act 16.
