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

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

Under current law, the amount of general purpose revenue that may be appropriated in any fiscal biennium is limited to the amount appropriated in the prior fiscal biennium, adjusted by the annual percentage change in this state's aggregate personal income. Currently, however, the limitation does not apply to an appropriation for principal repayment and interest payments on public debt and other payments relating to public debt; an appropriation to honor a moral obligation pledge; an appropriation contained in a bill that is enacted with approval of at least two-thirds of the members of each house of the legislature; an appropriation for certain legal expenses and costs; an appropriation for tax relief; an appropriation to make a transfer from the general fund to the budget stabilization fund; or an appropriation to the Higher Educational Aids Board, the Department of Public Instruction, and the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System.

This draft is a little off what we need here. As I read this, any shared revenue payment in any year would be exempt from the limit. That is not the intent.

The FY03 shared revenue was paid from the tobacco endowment fund on a one-time basis. FY04 and thereafter it is back to GPR. Had it stayed GPR in FY03, there would not be a problem with the spending limit. But the simple act of restoring the funding to GPR exceeds the spending limit, even if everything else would decrease.

I suppose the simplest change would be to limit the exclusion to the 2003-05 biennium only.
