Please change the allocation for indirect childcare items as follows:

- 1. Under s.49.155 (1g) (b): change the allocations to \$6,679,100 for both FY04 and FY05.
- 2. Under s.49.155 (1g) (b): delete the references as follows:

From the appropriation under <u>s. 20.445 (3) (mc)</u>, distribute \$44,955,200 <u>6,679,100</u> in <u>each</u> fiscal year <u>2001-02</u> and \$27,977,500 in fiscal year <u>2002-03</u> for the purposes of <u>providing technical</u> assistance for child care providers, for administering the child care program under this section, and for grants under <u>s. 49.136 (2)</u> for the start-up and expansion of child day care services, for child day care start-up and expansion planning, for grants under <u>s. 49.134 (2)</u> for child day care resource and referral services, for grants under <u>s. 49.137 (3)</u> to assist child care providers in meeting the quality of care standards established under <u>sub. (1d)</u>, for a system of rates or a program of grants, as provided under <u>sub.
