Hi Pam.

I have some thing to add for this draft:

In FY04, we are planning to use \$10,154,100 in FED expenditure authority that is currently in the JCF's federal funds supplemental appropriation under s.20.865(4)(m) for the TANF budget, meaning we want to appropriate those funds in DWD's appropriation under s. 20.445(3)(md). The JCF appropriation s.20.865(4)(m) is a \$0 appropriation, so we won't show the reduction in the chapter 20 schedule.

I'm thinking that what we need is a [non] statutory provision that transfers \$10,154,100 in FY04 from s.20.865(4)(m) to s.20.445(3)(md), in order to get the expenditure authority where we want it. As you know, the revenue sources that are used for the TANF allocations under s.49.175(1) are specified in s.49.175 - s.20.445(3)(md) is one of those revenue sources; we're trying to get another \$10,154,100 into s.20.445(3)(md).

For your information, here is the history on this: The JCF met in December 18, 2001 under s.13.10. At that meeting, a motion (#2009) was approved to transfer \$15,000,000 FED (TANF) from DWD's appropriation under s.20.445(3)(md) to the JCF's federal funds supplemental appropriation under s.20.865(4)(m). The funding came from anticipated underspending in the 2000-2001 W-2 contracts (if you read the motion, it references the allocation under s.49.175(1)(b)]. The entire \$15 M was to be set aside as a contingency fund for W-2 cash benefits, per the motion. To date, JCF has not released any of the \$15 M to DWD for W-2 cash benefits (or any other purpose).

NOTE: this is a separate "W-2 contingency fund" from the one created in 2001 Act 16, under appr. s.20.865(4)(k). The amount in s.20.865(4)(k) is just \$5.3 M. But since we want to transfer \$10.1 M, I thought it made more sense to just take it from the larger W-2 contingency fund (i.e, the one in s.20.865(4)(m)).

The \$15 M FED has been "transferred" - that is, in the state's accounting system, we moved \$15 M in expenditure authority from DWD's appr. to JCF's appropriation. Now, we are trying to transfer back some of that \$15 to DWD. I'm not sure if you have a recommendation for how else to accomplish this - all I could think of was a including the transfer in non-statutory language.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE V

Under current law, DWD is required to allocate specific amounts of moneys in each fiscal year, including federal moneys received under the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant program, for various public assistance programs. This bill increases and decreases the amounts of moneys that DWD is required to allocate in each fiscal year for the various public assistance programs. The bill also eliminates some of the TANF allocations under current law, including those for payment of community reinvestment funds, for food stamp benefits for legal immigrants, for distributions to the Wisconsin Trust Account Foundation for providing legal services to certain low–income individuals, for grants to organizations providing community–based alcohol and other drug abuse treatment for certain low–income individuals, and for the statewide immunization program for school children. Eliminating the allocation of TANF funds does not eliminate a program or service that has other funding.

Yes - amend (1) (b) by taking out the services

Yes - combine the services from (1) (b) and worksite services from (1) (fm).

Yes - the new amounts I gave you replace what is currently in the draft for (b) and (fm).

\*Note: you should hold off on this change for now, because we might also combine the allocation for individualized education and training in the ever growing services allocation (again, in the name of flexibility).

I saw your addendum note, and yes, that is correct.

Also, we may decide to not repeal the allocation under s.49.175 (1)(c), Performance bonuses. Instead, we'd leave it in the statutes but indicate \$0 for each year. This is so that if additional TANF funding became available, we could appropriate the additional TANF for performance bonuses (if a decision was made to do that) by getting approval from the JCF under 14-day passive review, instead of having to go back the full legislature for approval (if we want to use unappropriated TANF for any purpose not specified in the allocations under s.49.175 (1), we have to go to the full Legislature [miscellaneous legislation] for approval).

So, you may want to hold off this change for now.

Pam, here are some changes we'd like to make to LRB draft 1752/P1. Most are minor - just the last one is more involved.

- Section 7: under s.20.445 (3)(md), please <u>delete</u> the references to s. 20.435 (5)(ky) and s.20.465 (4)(k). I'm sorry I didn't catch these earlier - they are appropriations to which TANF is transferred, but we're eliminating funding for the items funded under those appropriations (immunization/nutrition in DHFS and Badger Challenge in DMA).
- Section 7: under s.20.445 (3)(md), please add references to s.20.435 (4)(kz) and (6)(kx) in lines 7-8. One of the items we're increasing TANF funding for (Children of recipients of supplemental security income) will be funded out of these DHFS appropriations (currently, there is no funding.
- Section 54: instead of repealing all of s.119.73, please just delete the words "and the early childhood education programs under s. 119.72".

 Section 19: we would like to separate out the allocation for W-2 administration, but then combine the allocations for W-2 ancillary services and worksite services:

2004-2005 contracts:	\$9,500,000	\$19,000,000

W-2 ancillary services, worksite services and mentoring	FY04	FY05

You will need to amend the language for the W-2 ancillary services, worksite services and mentoring allocation; I would suggest:

2002-2003 contracts: For program services offered to W-2 participants by W-2 agencies, including transportation assistance for individuals who are eligible to receive temporary assistance for needy families under 42 USC 601 et seq., ...

2004-2005 contracts: For services offered to W-2 participants by W-2 agencies, including transportation assistance for individuals who are eligible to receive temporary assistance for needy families under 42 USC 601 et seq., and for transitional subsidized private sector job employers, to be used for costs associated with employing persons in those positions, including mentoring and other services, ...

I know this gets kind of wordy ... We assumed a certain split between the existing W-2 employment positions and the new transitional jobs. The worksite services are for just those people in transitional jobs. So, to the extent that the proportion of people in transitional jobs is greater or less than we have assumed, we want to give DWD the flexibility to use the funds in this allocation as needed between W-2 ancillary services and the worksite services for persons in transitional subsidized jobs.

### PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Under current law, DWD is required to allocate specific amounts of moneys in each fiscal year, including federal moneys received under the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant program, for various public assistance programs. This bill increases and decreases the amounts of moneys that DWD is required to allocate in each fiscal year for the various public assistance programs. The bill also eliminates some of the TANF allocations under current law, including those for payment of community reinvestment funds, for food stamp benefits for legal immigrants, for distributions to the Wisconsin Trust Account Foundation for providing legal services to certain low—income individuals, for grants to organizations providing community—based alcohol and other drug abuse treatment for certain low—income individuals, and for the statewide immunization program for school children. Eliminating the allocation of TANF funds does not eliminate a program or service that has other funding.


