Under current law, the office of the governor is located in the capitol. The lieutenant governor, attorney general, and supreme court must each keep a room in the capitol. With the approval of the building commission, DOA may temporarily relocate the governor, the lieutenant governor, attorney general, supreme court, or the clerks of the supreme court and court of appeals from the capitol to another suitable building in the city of Madison, and the joint committee on legislative organization may temporarily relocate the offices of any legislative committee from the capitol to another such building, for the purpose of performing air conditioning or other renovation work in the capitol. A sum sufficient appropriation from general purpose revenue pays the costs associated with the permanent or temporary relocation of offices located in the capitol.

This bill repeals the authority to temporarily relocate offices in the capitol for the purpose of performing air conditioning or other renovation work and also repeals the sum sufficient appropriation for relocation expenses effective on July 1, 2003.
