Gordon, I submitted an draft earlier to transfer the apprenticeship program from GPR funding to PRF funding (unemployment insurance Reed Act funds) in s.20.445(1). I was informed, however, that no statutory or non-statutory language was required to switch funding sources. DWD, just sent me an e-mail with the requirements for Reed Act appropriations. According to them the language for 108.161 should do the following:

1. A state's appropriation authorizing the use of Reed Act must (a) limit the use of funds appropriated exclusively to administrative expenses for the Employment Security program and (b) specify the purpose for which the funds are appropriated and the amount appropriated for each purpose.

If the purpose is to use the Reed Act Funds for the Apprenticeship program, we need to state a purpose such as the following: "To provide DWD with the staff necessary to perform promotional, developmental and coordinating activities to increase apprenticeship sponsors and apprenticeships in high skilled and demand occupations".

The quoted language is what we presented to the US Department of Labor when they questioned our past use of Reed Act funds for two apprenticeship positions.

- 2. The appropriation must direct the Unemployment Fund's treasurer to transfer the appropriate amounts to the Administrative account only as and to the extent that they are currently needed for such expenditures.
- 3. The appropriation must clearly state that the funds are not available for obligation after the two-year period. The two year period begins on the date the appropriation becomes law.
- 4. The appropriation must limit the total amount which may be obligated during any fiscal year to the aggregate of all amounts credited under the Reed Act distribution.

It appears to me that s.108.161 already meets the criteria under items 2-4, but would it be possible to reactivate the apprenticeship draft to include language similar to what DWD proprosed under item 1, "To provide DWD with the staff necessary to perform promotional, developmental and coordinating activities to increase apprenticeship sponsors and apprenticeships in high skilled and demand occupations".
