On page 450 of LRB 1922/1, line 22-23, the section regarding investment in land in the state, it refers to the limitation established in par. (c). However, in looking at page 451, lines 8 to 19, it would appear that in reconciling the two drafts, par. (c) became par. (d).

Could you confirm this? We can then write up an errata form on it.

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

What is your take on this? This is actually a little different than the issue raised by Jeff K in the drafter's note for draft 1264/1 [transfer of monies from (1)(m) to (1)(n)/direct credit of reimbursements to (1)(n)]. Since we're not repealing (1)(m), the unencumbered balance in (1)(m) associated with UI, ER and WC would not lapse to the general fund at the end of FY03; rather, they would remain in (1)(m). I'm wondering if the transfer of revenues from 20.445 (1)(m) to 20.445 (1)(n), 20.445 (1)(o) and 20.445 (1)(p) could be handled administratively, since we're not repealing (1)(m) and all of these appropriations are federal continuing appropriations -?

If not, then we should get a technical amendment drafted soon.

Josh:

Yes, in fact, Jeff Kuesel raised that possibility in his drafter's note to LRB-1264/1. Jeff wrote that if a one-time transfer from s. 20.445 (1) (m) to (n) is desired, then we need to redraft. Otherwise, we assumed that any future federal moneys can be credited directly to the new appropriations.

Ordinarily, either a sum certain or the entire unencumbered balance in an appropriation is transferred. In this case, because some moneys will stay in (m) and other moneys are going to (n), (o), and (p), we will need to tailor the language to read something like "(t)he unencumbered balance in s. 20.445 (1) (m) that is attributable to federal moneys received for unemployment compensation administration, as determined by the secretary of administration, is transferred to s. 20.445 (1) (n)." And similar language for worker's compensation and equal rights activities.

We can probably handle this in a technical amendment. Would you like us to draft one?

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
