Motion:

Move to require DNR to provide \$750,000 annually for the "Into the Outdoors" television program produced in conjunction with Discover Wisconsin Productions.

Note:

The Department currently contracts with Discover Wisconsin Productions for \$750,000 annually to produce the nature-based television series "Into the Outdoors". Although the payment is made through the Bureau of Communication and Education, all programs (including Administration and Technology and Customer Service) contribute funding for the contract. DNR has indicated that it intends to end its contract after the 2004 production season as a means of meeting expenditure reductions included in the bill. If DNR was prohibited from ending the contract, expenditure reductions would need to be taken from another source within the Department.
