e. Paper #379 (Medical Assistance Trust Fund): Modify the Governor's recommendations by requiring the Department of Administration to submit a report to the Joint Committee on Finance by December 1, 2003, that: (a) compares the amount of funding budgeted for MA benefits under the biennial budget act with projected MA expenditures in the 2003-05 biennium; (b) identifies all federal funding that is available to support MA benefits in the 2003-05 biennium, including any supplemental funding the state may receive as a result of federal legislation, approval of federal waivers or the creation or expansion of intergovernmental transfer programs; and (c) includes proposals and recommendations, including proposed statutory changes, to reduce MA benefits costs if projected expenditures exceed projected revenue.


