Targeted Runoff Management Earmark [LFB Paper #563]

Motion:

Move to earmark \$250,000 in authorized bonding for a grant under the targeted runoff management (TRM) grant program to support bluff mitigation along County Highway LS. Further, direct DNR to provide Sheboygan County with a \$250,000 grant under the TRM program for bluff mitigation along County Highway LS. Exempt the award from the maximum grant amount for the program, and the program's restriction on uses of funds.

Note:

Under the bill, \$9,546,800 in general obligation bonding revenue would be authorized for DNR's priority watershed and targeted runoff management (TRM) programs.

The TRM grant program offers competitive financial awards to support small-scale, shortterm projects (generally one to three years) that are completed by local governmental units. The following requirements apply to grants awarded under the TRM grant program: (a) both urban and rural projects can be funded through a TRM grant, with up to 70% of a project's eligible costs funded by the grants, with a maximum of \$150,000 in state funding; (b) the project may last up to three years, but DNR may extend this period one year at its discretion; (c) the project's application identifies the specific watershed, sub-watershed or site of the project; (d) the project will implement nonpoint source pollution control best management practices in an area that is a target area based on the need to comply with one of the following (1) DNR standards, (2) the existence of impaired water bodies that the Department has identified to the federal EPA, (3) the existence of outstanding or exceptional resource waters (as designated by statute), (4) the existence of threats to public health, (5) the existence of an animal feeding operation that has received a notice of discharge or a notice of intent to issue a notice of discharge, or (6) other water quality concerns of national or statewide importance; (e) the project is consistent with priorities identified by DNR on a watershed or other geographic basis; (f) the project is consistent with DATCP approved land and water conservation plans; and (g) DNR and DATCP have determined that the funding provided under DATCP's soil and water resource management program is insufficient to fund the project.

The earmarked funding would be used to mitigate bluff erosion on County Highway LS along the Lake Michigan shoreline in Sheboygan County. The Army Corps of Engineers has developed a Section 14 emergency shoreline protection project plan for this mitigation that it estimates would cost \$1,102,000.
