8 services, as determined by the department of revenue, based on the financial reports
9 required under s. 73.10 (2) and recorded in the governmental and proprietary fund
10 types, divided by the municipality’s 2002 population, except that “actual per capita
11 conservation, development, and library cost” may not be less than zero.

12 (b) “Actual per capita public safety cost” means a municipality’s actual
13 expenditures, net of any related revenues, incurred in 2001 for operations and
14 capital outlays related to public safety services, as determined by the department of
15 revenue, based on the financial reports required under s. 73.10 (2) and recorded in
16 the governmental and proprietary fund types, divided by the municipality’s 2002
17 population, except that “actual per capita public safety cost” may not be less than
18 zero.

19 (c) “Adjusted per capita conservation, development, and library cost” means the
20 sum of a municipality’s primary per capita conservation, development, and library
21 cost and the municipality’s secondary per capita conservation, development, and
22 library cost.

1 (d) “Adjusted per capita public safety cost” means the sum of a municipality’s
2 primary per capita public safety cost and the municipality’s secondary per capita
3 public safety cost.

4 (e) “Aidable costs” means an amount calculated as follows:

5 1. Add a municipality’s adjusted per capita public safety cost to the
6 municipality’s adjusted per capita conservation, development, and library cost.

7 2. Multiply the result under subd. 1. by the municipality’s 2002 population.

8 3. Multiply the result under subd. 2. by the municipality’s poverty factor.

9 (f) “Average per capita conservation, development, and library cost” means the
10 total 2001 conservation, development, and library expenditures, net of any related
11 revenues, for all municipalities that are eligible to receive a payment under this
12 section, divided by the total 2002 population for all municipalities that are eligible
13 to receive a payment under this section and that reported 2001 conservation,
14 development, and library expenditures.

15 (g) “Average per capita public safety cost” means the total 2001 public safety
16 expenditures, net of any related revenues, for all municipalities that are eligible to
17 receive a payment under this section, divided by the total 2002 population for all
18 municipalities that are eligible to receive a payment under this section and that
19 reported 2001 public safety expenditures.

20 (h) “Per capita full value” means the quotient of the 2002 equalized value of the
21 property of a municipality, excluding the incremental value in tax increment
22 districts, divided by the municipality’s population in 2002.

23 (i) Notwithstanding s. 79.005 (2), “population” means the number of persons
24 residing in a municipality, as determined by the department of administration under
25 s. 16.96.

1 (j) “Poverty factor” means:

2 1. For municipalities that had a 2002 population of 50,000 or more, an amount
3 determined by dividing the percentage of the municipality’s population with an
4 income at or below the poverty level, as determined in the 2000 federal decennial
5 census, by a percentage equal to the product of 1.3 multiplied by the percentage of
6 the state’s population with an income at or below the poverty level, as determined
7 in the 2000 federal decennial census, except that a poverty factor determined under
8 this subdivision shall be no less than 1.0 and no more than 1.35.

9 2. For municipalities that had a 2002 population less than 50,000, 1.0.

10 (k) “Primary per capita conservation, development, and library cost” means a
11 municipality’s actual per capita conservation, development, and library cost, not to
12 exceed an amount equal to one-half of the average per capita conservation,
13 development, and library cost, multiplied by 1.5.

14 (L) “Primary per capita public safety cost” means a municipality’s actual per
15 capita public safety cost, not to exceed an amount equal to one-half of the average
16 per capita public safety cost, multiplied by 1.5.

17 (m) “Secondary per capita conservation, development, and library cost” means
18 a municipality’s actual per capita conservation, development, and library cost in
19 excess of an amount equal to one-half of the average per capita conservation,
20 development, and library cost, but not to exceed an amount equal to the average per
21 capita conservation, development, and library cost, multiplied by 0.5.

22 (n) “Secondary per capita public safety cost” means a municipality’s actual per
23 capita public safety cost in excess of an amount equal to one-half of the average per
24 capita public safety cost, but not to exceed an amount equal to the average per capita
25 public safety cost, multiplied by 0.5.

1 (o) “Sharing factor” means 1.0, minus the quotient of a municipality’s per capita
2 full value divided by the standard value, except that if the quotient of a
3 municipality’s per capita full value divided by the standard value is greater than 1.0,
4 the sharing factor is zero.

5 (p) “Standard value” means the per capita value that results in the distribution
6 of the entire funding level.

7 (2) ELIGIBILITY. Except as provided in sub. (3), in 2004 and in 2005, a
8 municipality is eligible for a payment under this section if the municipality is
9 incorporated and had a population in 2002 of at least 2,500 or the municipality is
10 unincorporated and had a population in 2002 of at least 5,000.

11 (3) EXCEPTIONS. A municipality shall not receive a payment under this section
12 if the sum of the municipality’s actual per capita public safety cost for 2001 and the
13 municipality’s actual per capita conservation, development, and library cost for 2001
14 is less than \$50.

15 (4) PAYMENTS. Each municipality that is eligible to receive a payment under
16 this section shall receive a payment in 2004 and in 2005 that is equal to the greater
17 of the municipality’s population in 2002 multiplied by \$23 or the municipality’s
18 aidable costs multiplied by the municipality’s sharing factor.

19 (5) MINIMUM PAYMENT. (a) If the payment to any municipality under sub. (4)
20 in any year is less than 88.5% of the combined payments to the municipality under
21 ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding payments under s. 79.04, the municipality has
22 an aids deficiency. The amount of the aids deficiency is the amount by which 88.5%
23 of the combined payments to the municipality under ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003,
24 excluding payments under s. 79.04, exceeds the payment under sub. (4) to the
25 municipality in the current year.

1 (b) A municipality that has an aids deficiency shall receive a payment from the
2 amounts withheld under sub. (6) equal to its aids deficiency for that year.

3 (6) MAXIMUM PAYMENT. (a) In this subsection, “maximum allowable increase”
4 in any year means a percentage such that the sum for all municipalities in the year
5 of the excess of payments under sub. (4), over the payments as limited by the
6 maximum allowable increase, is equal to the sum of the aids deficiency under sub.
7 (5) in that year.

8 (b) If the payment to any municipality under sub. (4) in any year exceeds the
9 combined payments to the municipality under ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding
10 payments under s. 79.04, by more than the maximum allowable increase, the excess
11 shall be withheld to fund the minimum payments in that year under sub. (5) (b).

12 (7) DISTRIBUTIONS. (a) In 2004, the total amount to be distributed to
13 municipalities under sub. (4) from the municipal aid account and s. 20.835 (1) (t) and
14 (u) is \$567,957,200.

15 (b) In 2005, the total amount to be distributed to municipalities under sub. (4)
16 from the municipal aid account is \$567,957,200.

17 (c) Beginning in 2006, no municipality may receive a payment under this
18 section.

19 SECTION 1669e. 79.044 of the statutes is created to read:

20 **79.044 Expenditure restraint supplemental aid. (1) DEFINITIONS.** In this
21 section:

22 (a) “Full value” has the meaning given in s. 79.05 (1) (a).

23 (b) “Inflation factor” has the meaning given in s. 79.05 (1) (am).

24 (c) “Municipal budget” has the meaning given in s. 79.05 (1) (b).

25 (d) “Property tax levy rate” has the meaning given in s. 79.05 (1) (c).

1 (e) “Valuation factor” has the meaning given in s. 79.05 (1) (d).

2 (2) ELIGIBILITY. A municipality is eligible for a payment under sub. (3) if it
3 fulfills all of the following requirements:

4 (a) It is eligible for a payment under s. 79.043.

5 (b) Its property tax levy rate for 2002 is greater than 8 mills.

6 (c) Its municipal budget, exclusive of principal and interest on long-term debt
7 and exclusive of revenue sharing payments under s. 66.0305 and recycling fee
8 payments under s. 289.645, for 2002 increased over its municipal budget, exclusive
9 of principal and interest on long-term debt and exclusive of revenue sharing
10 payments under s. 66.0305 and recycling fee payments under s. 289.645, for 2001 by
11 less than the sum of the inflation factor and the valuation factor, rounded to the
12 nearest 0.10%.

13 (3) PAYMENTS. In 2004 and in 2005, each municipality that qualifies under sub.

14 (2) shall receive a payment calculated as follows:

15 (a) Subtract 8 mills from the municipality’s property tax levy rate.

16 (b) Multiply the amount under par. (a) by the municipality’s full value.

17 (c) Divide the amount under par. (b) by the total of the amounts under par. (b)
18 for all municipalities that qualify.

19 (d) Multiply the amount under par. (c) by \$10,000,000.

20 (4) MINIMUM PAYMENT. (a) If the combined payments to any municipality under
21 sub. (3) and s. 79.043 in any year is less than 90% of the combined payments to the
22 municipality under ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding payments under s. 79.04,
23 the municipality has an aids deficiency. The amount of the aids deficiency is the
24 amount by which 90% of the combined payments to the municipality under ss. 79.03

1 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding payments under s. 79.04, exceeds the combined
2 payments under sub. (3) and s. 79.043 to the municipality in the current year.

3 (b) A municipality that has an aids deficiency shall receive a payment from the
4 amounts withheld under sub. (5) equal to its aids deficiency for that year.

5 (5) MAXIMUM PAYMENT. (a) In this subsection, “maximum allowable increase”
6 in any year means a percentage such that the sum for all municipalities in the year
7 of the excess of the combined payments under sub. (3) and s. 79.043, over the
8 payments as limited by the maximum allowable increase, is equal to the sum of the
9 aids deficiencies under sub. (4) in that year.

10 (b) If the combined payments to any municipality under sub. (3) and s. 79.043

4 of less than 5,000; or the sum of the municipality's actual per capita public safety cost
5 for 2001 and the municipality's actual per capita conservation, development, and
6 library cost for 2001 is less than \$50.

7 (3) PAYMENTS. Each municipality that is eligible to receive a payment under
8 this section shall receive a payment in 2004 and in 2005 that is equal to the combined
9 payments to the municipality under ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding payments
10 under s. 79.04, multiplied by a percentage that results in the distribution of the
11 entire funding level.

12 (4) DISTRIBUTIONS. (a) Beginning in 2004 and ending with the distribution in

8 from the municipal aid account is \$10,000,000.

9 (b) Beginning in 2006, no municipality may receive a payment under this
10 section.

11 **SECTION 1669f.** 79.045 of the statutes is created to read:

12 **79.045 Small municipalities state aid. (1) DEFINITIONS.** In this section:

13 (a) “Actual per capita conservation, development, and library cost” has the
14 meaning given in s. 79.043 (1) (a).

15 (b) “Actual per capita public safety cost” has the meaning given in s. 79.043 (1)
16 (b).

17 (c) Notwithstanding s. 79.005 (2), “population” means the number of persons
18 residing in a municipality, as determined by the department of administration under
19 s. 16.96.

20 (2) **ELIGIBILITY.** In 2004 and in 2005, a municipality is eligible for a payment
21 under this section if the municipality is incorporated and had a population in 2002
22 of less than 2,500; the municipality is unincorporated and had a population in 2002
23 of less than 5,000; or the sum of the municipality’s actual per capita public safety cost
24 for 2001 and the municipality’s actual per capita conservation, development, and
25 library cost for 2001 is less than \$50.

1 **(3) PAYMENTS.** Each municipality that is eligible to receive a payment under
2 this section shall receive a payment in 2004 and in 2005 that is equal to the combined
3 payments to the municipality under ss. 79.03 and 79.06 in 2003, excluding payments
4 under s. 79.04, multiplied by a percentage that results in the distribution of the
5 entire funding level.

6 **(4) DISTRIBUTIONS.** (a) Beginning in 2004 and ending with the distribution in
7 2005, the total amount to be distributed each year to municipalities under sub. (3)
8 from the municipal aid account is \$125,145,000.

9 (b) Beginning in 2006, no municipality may receive a payment under this
10 section.

11 **SECTION 1669g.** 79.046 of the statutes is created to read:

12 **79.046 Municipal aid distribution.** Beginning in 2006, the amount to be
13 distributed to municipalities is \$703,102,200.”.
