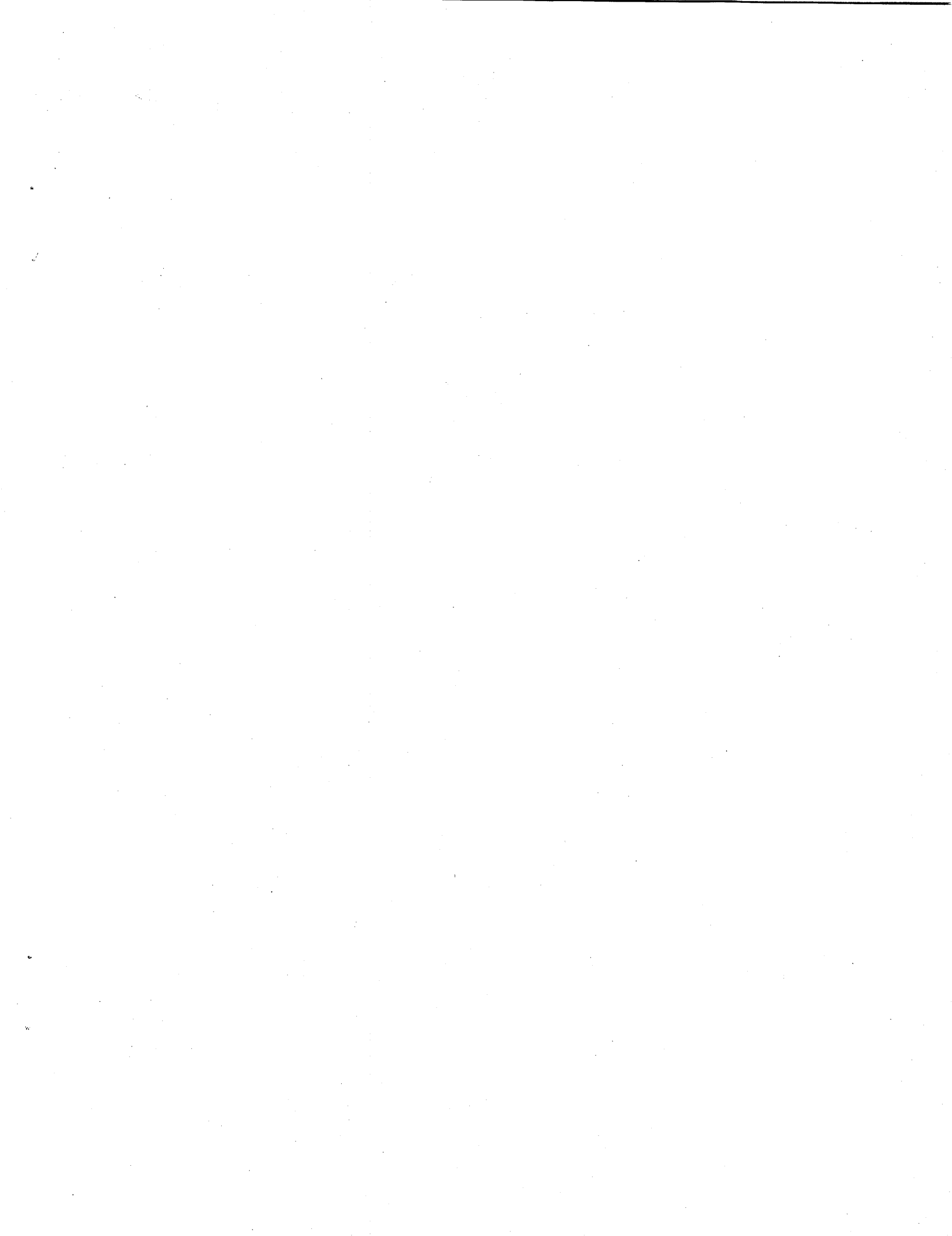

2 **providing a penalty.**

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who intentionally marks, draws, or writes on or etches onto another person's property without the person's consent is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than \$10,000 or sentenced to the county jail for up to nine months or both. If, however, the property is reduced in value by more than \$2,500, the person is guilty of a felony and may be fined up to \$10,000 or sentenced to a term of imprisonment (consisting of a term of confinement in state prison followed by a term of extended supervision) of up to three and one-half years or both. This bill lowers the damage threshold for the felony version of the offense to \$1,000.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report concerning the proposed penalty and the costs or savings that are likely to result if the bill is enacted.
