I would like to have the following amendment drafted regarding the budget bill passed by the JFC. The topic of the amendment is legislative reform, so I believe this is an issue for you. If someone else needs to prepare this, let me know. There are nine issues to be collapsed into one "legislative reform" amendment. Please give me a call if you have any questions.

Legislative Reform Amendment.

- WES* a. Alternative minimum state income tax for legislators of \$1000
- JTK* b. Banning fundraising by members of JFC and majority and minority leaders prior to passage of the budget
- PJD* c. Reduce size of legislature to 66 reps and 22 Senators, effective 2004 election.
- PJD* d. Bar legislators' state-paid out-of-state travel for next two years
- PJD* e. Require both Senate and Assembly to approve the use of public funds to pay for attorney's fees
- PJD* f. No Per Diems for legislators budget does not pass by June 30, 2003
- JTK* g. Require referendum ~~by next~~ February 17, 2004, for the following question: "Do you believe that the legislature has done enough in passing measures regarding campaign finance reform?"
- PJD* h. Call for special session to take up the issue of campaign finance reform on Tuesday, September 23, 2003, at 10:00 a.m.
- RAC* i. Legislature must vote on any legislators' pay increases

2003 SENATE RESOLUTION

1 **To create** senate rule 21m; **relating to:** prohibitions on fund-raising social events
2 and related campaign contributions by legislative leaders of the senate before
3 the date of enactment of the executive budget bill.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Senate Rule 21m: This rule is created to prohibit fund-raising social events and related campaign contributions by legislative leaders of the senate before the date of enactment of the executive budget bill.

Resolved by the senate, That:

4 **SECTION 1.** Senate rule 21m is created to read:

5 SENATE RULE 21m. **Campaign contributions.** (1) In this rule:

6 (a) "Contribution," "legislative campaign committee," and "personal campaign
7 committee" have the meanings given for the terms in section 11.01 of the statutes.

8 (b) "Legislative leader" means a member of the senate committee on
9 organization or the senate committee on finance.
10

1 (2) A legislative leader may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or
2 receive, a contribution for or at; or authorize a legislative campaign committee to
3 schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for or at; and a
4 legislative leader may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a
5 contribution for or at; or authorize his or her personal campaign committee to
6 schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for or at; a
7 fund-raising social event or otherwise after January 1 of the odd-numbered year
8 and before the date of enactment, as defined in section 35.095 (1) (a) of the statutes,
9 of the executive budget bill introduced under section 16.47 (1) of the statutes.

10 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a legislative
11 campaign committee held during the period between the first day authorized for
12 filing nomination papers for any special election to the senate and the date of the
13 special election.

14 (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
15 member of the senate or his or her personal campaign committee held during the
16 period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for any office for
17 which a current member of the senate is a candidate and the date of the election for
18 that office, if the event is held within the boundaries of the jurisdiction or district
19 served by the office for which the current member of the senate is a candidate.

20 (5) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
21 member of the senate or his or her personal campaign committee held during the
22 period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for any office,
23 other than senator, for which a current member of the senate is a candidate and the
24 date of the election for that other office.

1 ***To renumber*** joint rule chapter 11; and ***to create*** joint rule chapter 11; **relating to:**
2 prohibitions on fund-raising social events and related campaign contributions
3 for legislative leaders of the legislature before the date of enactment of the
4 executive budget bill.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Joint Rule 94: This joint rule is created to prohibit fund-raising social events and related campaign contributions for legislative leaders of the legislature before the date of enactment of the executive budget bill.

5 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That:***

6 **SECTION 1.** Joint rule chapter 11 is renumbered joint rule chapter 12.

7 **SECTION 2.** Joint rule chapter 11 is created to read:

9 **CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS**

10 **JOINT RULE 94. Campaign contributions.** (1) In this rule:

1 (a) "Contribution," "legislative campaign committee," and "personal campaign
2 committee" have the meanings given for the terms in section 11.01 of the statutes.

3 (b) "Legislative leader" means a member of the senate or assembly committee
4 on organization or the joint committee on finance.

5 (2) A legislative leader may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or
6 receive, a contribution for or at; or authorize a legislative campaign committee to
7 schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for or at; and a
8 legislative leader may not schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a
9 contribution for or at; or authorize his or her personal campaign committee to
10 schedule, hold, or attend, or solicit, make, or receive, a contribution for or at; a
11 fund-raising social event or otherwise after January 1 of the odd-numbered year
12 and before the date of enactment, as defined in section 35.095 (1) (a) of the statutes,
13 of the executive budget bill introduced under section 16.47 (1) of the statutes.

14 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a legislative
15 campaign committee held during the period between the first day authorized for
16 filing nomination papers for any special election to the senate or assembly and the
17 date of the special election.

18 (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
19 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held
20 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for
21 any office for which a current member of the senate or assembly is a candidate and
22 the date of the election for that office, if the event is held within the boundaries of
23 the jurisdiction or district served by the office for which the current member of the
24 senate or assembly is a candidate.

1 (5) Subsection (2) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current
2 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held
3 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for
4 any office, other than senator, in the case of a member of the senate, or other than
5 representative to the assembly, in the case of a member of the assembly, for which
6 a current member of the senate or assembly is a candidate and the date of the election
7 for that other office.

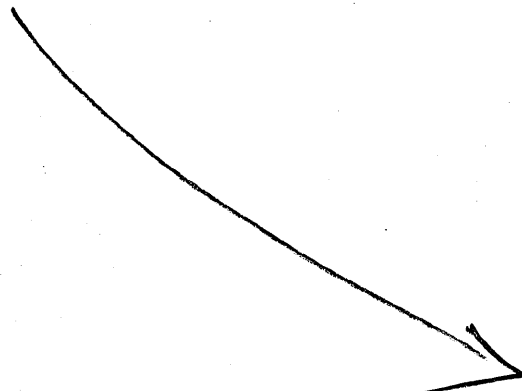

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**SENATE AMENDMENT 2,
TO 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 1**

June 4, 2003 - Offered by Senator CARPENTER.

At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 1, line 6: after "value" insert ", prohibiting political contributions in connection with certain fund-raising events,".

2. Page 3, line 14: after that line insert:

SECTION 11.386 of the statutes is created to read:

11.386 Contributions in connection with certain fundraising events prohibited. (1) In this section, "legislator responsible for budgetary decisions" means the majority leaders and minority leaders of the assembly and senate and the members of the joint committee on finance.

(2) Except as provided in subs. (3) and (4), no legislator responsible for budgetary decisions and no personal campaign committee or support committee authorized under s. 11.05 (3) (p) of such a member may receive any contribution in conjunction with a fund-raising social event held during the period beginning on the

1 date of introduction of the biennial budget bill or bills under s. 16.47 (1)✓ and the date
2 of final passage of the bill or bills.

3 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a contribution made to an individual who
4 is a candidate for state office at a special election or to a personal campaign
5 committee of such a candidate during the period beginning on the date that the
6 special election is ordered and ending on the date of the special election.

7 (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to a contribution made to an individual
8 against whom a recall petition has been filed during the period beginning on the date
9 that the petition offered for filing is filed under s. 9.10 (3) (b) and ending on the date
10 of the recall election unless the official resigns at an earlier date under s. 9.10 (3) (c).".
