DATCP

Return language for pet shelter, kennel and breeder regulation to 2001 AB 278 language (Page 47; Item #9; Pet Breeder, Kennel and Shelter Regulation of comparative summary) language in bill, not just current law

DHFS

1. Require DHFS sever its relationship with Attic Correctional Services Inc. for locating and acquiring housing for Chapter 980 releases. Allow for a 30-day written notification.

2. Earmark \$50,000 annually from Grants for Services to Victims of Domestic Violence (Pg. 282 Item 3 comparative summary) for a services coordinator for ASHA Family Services. (Pg. 282 Item 3).

3. Increase the personal care allowance by \$5 per month, and fund it by transferring the DATCP Consumer Protection Services to DOJ. (LFB Paper 156 (Page 92-95, Comparative Summary of Budget Recommendations, June 2003).

DNR

Brownfields-(Representative Balow's office worked with Kendra Bonderud from Fiscal Bureau on this.) In general, this amendment would take us back to the Governor's proposal in regards to Brownfields with the exception of moving the program from DNR to Commerce.

Provisions of amendment:

-Increase the Vehicle Environmental Impact Fee from \$9 to \$10.50 and remove the sunset date. Subsequently, restore all cuts made by Joint Finance under this provision, including reductions in FTE positions beyond the 7.0 FTE in the Governor's recommendation (pg. 480).

-Provide \$6,000,000 in general bonding authority to conduct remedial action at contaminated sites, thus increasing DNR's general obligation bonding from \$41 million to \$47 million.

-Restore the DNR Air and Waste Division operations appropriation from the environmental management account to \$3,868,800 annually. (JFC cut it by \$1,120,000 SEG annually.) Restore any FTE reductions proposed by JFC. (Second paragraph on pg. 487).

DOJ-

1. Remove the lapse of \$2.775 million of program revenue to the general fund from the PR generated by the \$2 increase in the Crime Laboratory and Drug Law Enforcement Assessment. Send the PR to crime labs, not the general fund (JFC-Motion 580, page 416, item #7 of comparative summary).

2. Again dealing with the PR increase with the Crime Laboratory and Drug Law Enforcement Assessment. The budget amendment should keep the lapse, but also raise the fee again to an amount (approximately \$8-\$9) that would generate the \$2.775 million was taken from the crime lab & DNA analysis account by Finance.

DPI

1. Give full effect to referenda held within last year to take effect in coming school year. (Page 511, No. 5 of comparative summary). In other words, the spending limit of a school which has passed a referendum in the past year which is only intended to take effect for the first time in the coming school year will be the referendum amount added to what spending limit would have been if LFB Paper 605 had not been enacted.

2. Allows school board of nonresident school district to create waiting list for open enrollment. (2003 AB 7)

ETF

Provide that the governor's prescription drug purchasing pool would be available to individuals who do not have employer-sponsored or privately acquired health insurance coverage that includes a pharmacy benefit. (Pg. 235, Item 11 of comparison summary, JFC Motion 700)

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 1. Page 844, line 12: delete the material beginning with that line and ending
3 with page 846, line 6, and substitute:

4 "SECTION 2120cd. 173.40 (6) of the statutes is created to read:

5 173.40 (6) PENALTIES. (a) A person who operates without a license required
6 under sub. (2) may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than
7 9 months or both.

8 (b) 1. Except as provided under par. (a), a person who violates this section or
9 a rule promulgated under this section may be required to forfeit not more than \$1,000
10 for the first offense and may be required to forfeit not less than \$200 nor more than
11 \$2000 for the 2nd or any subsequent offense within 5 years.

1 2. If a violation under subd. 1. involves the keeping of animals, each animal
2 with respect to which the statute or rule is violated constitutes a separate violation.

3 **SECTION 2120ch.** 174.05 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 174.05 (2) TAX. The minimum dog license tax is ~~\$3~~ \$5.50 for a neutered male
5 dog or spayed female dog, upon presentation of evidence that the dog is neutered or
6 spayed, and ~~\$8~~ \$10.50 for an unneutered male dog or unspayed female dog, or
7 one-half of these amounts if the dog became 5 months of age after July 1 of the license
8 year.

9 **SECTION 2120cL.** 174.053 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

10 174.053 (1) MULTIPLE DOG LICENSE OPTION. Any person who keeps more than one
11 dog may, instead of the license tax for each dog required by this chapter, apply to the
12 collecting official for a multiple dog license for the keeping of the dogs. Such person
13 shall pay for the license year a license tax of ~~\$35~~ \$45.50 for 12 or fewer dogs and an
14 additional ~~\$3~~ \$5.50 for each dog in excess of 12. Upon payment of the required
15 multiple dog license tax and upon presentation of evidence that all dogs over 5
16 months of age are currently immunized against rabies, the collecting official shall
17 issue the multiple dog license and a number of tags equal to the number of dogs
18 authorized to be kept by the person.

19 **SECTION 2120cp.** 174.07 (3) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

20 174.07 (3) (c) *Reimbursement.* The collecting official may retain ~~25~~ 75 cents,
21 or a greater amount established by the county board by ordinance or resolution, for
22 each license issued as compensation for the service, if the collecting official is not a
23 full-time, salaried municipal employee. If the collecting official is a full-time,

1 salaried municipal employee, this compensation shall be paid into the treasury of the
2 town, village, or city.

SECTION 2120ct. 174.09 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 174.09 (1) The dog license taxes so paid to the county treasurer shall be kept
5 in a separate account and shall be known as the "dog license fund" and shall be
6 appropriated and disbursed for the purposes and in the manner following: fund."

7 Within 30 days after receipt of the same dog license taxes⁽²⁾ the county treasurer shall
8 pay into the state treasury 5% of the minimum tax as provided for \$2 for each license
9 issued under s. 174.05 (2) of all dog license taxes which shall have been received by
10 the county treasurer, \$10 for each multiple dog license issued under s. 174.053 (1),
11 and \$2 for each dog in excess of 12 for which a multiple dog license is issued under
12 s. 174.053 (1)."

17 the statutes⁽²⁾ for the purpose of regulating pet ~~dealers,~~^{breeders,} kennels, and animal shelters."

18 ✓ **3.** Page 1143, line 6: delete the material beginning with "(1)" and ending with
19 "(5) (a)" on line 7 and substitute ^(✓) "(6)".
