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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill amends the Wisconsin Public Accommodations Law to permit a fitness center whose facilities and services are intended for the exclusive use of persons of the same sex to provide the use of those facilities and services exclusively to persons of that sex.

An average of less than two persons per year file complaints alleging discrimination based on sex by a fitness center, with the Equal Rights Division of the Department of Workforce Development. (In CY 2002, an individual filed complaints against 173 locations of a franchised fitness center, all involving this issue. Those complaints were placed in abeyance pending the outcome of the appeal of the first complaint.) Passage of this legislation would therefore have no significant impact on the workload of the division.

Informational brochures on the law that are published by the Equal Rights Division will need to be reprinted at a base cost of \$1,500 GPR. This cost will be absorbed by the agency.
