

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 2,  
TO 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 61**

**AN ACT** *to amend* 146.70 (7); *to repeal and recreate* 146.70 (3m) (d) 1g.; *to create* 20.155 (3), 22.07 (3m), 25.17 (1) (yo), 25.98, 77.51 (4) (b) 8., 77.51 (15) (b) 7. and 146.70 (3m) of the statutes; and *to affect* 1997 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9456 (3m) and 1997 Wisconsin Act 27, section 9456 (3m) (b); **relating to:** creating a wireless 911 fund; imposing a surcharge on wireless telephone customers; making grants for wireless 911 emergency telephone service; granting rule-making authority; and making an appropriation.

***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

- 1           **SECTION 1.** 20.155 (3) of the statutes is created to read:
- 2           20.155 **(3)** WIRELESS 911 GRANTS. (q) *General program operations and grants.*
- 3           From the wireless 911 fund, all moneys received under s. 146.70 (3m) (f) 1. to
- 4           administer and make grants under s. 146.70 (3m) (d) and supplemental grants under
- 5           s. 146.70 (3m) (e).

1           **SECTION 2.** 22.07 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

2           22.07 **(3m)** Administer a program to facilitate purchases, leases, and service  
3 contracts by local governments that operate wireless public safety answering points,  
4 as defined in s. 146.70 (3m) (a) 7. In administering the program under this  
5 subsection, the department shall, to the greatest extent practicable, ensure that such  
6 wireless public safety answering points are compatible with existing public safety  
7 answering points, as defined in s. 146.70 (1) (gm).

8           **SECTION 3.** 25.17 (1) (yo) of the statutes is created to read:

9           25.17 **(1)** (yo) Wireless 911 fund (s. 25.98);

10          **SECTION 4.** 25.98 of the statutes is created to read:

11          **25.98 Wireless 911 fund.** There is established a separate nonlapsible trust  
12 fund designated as the wireless 911 fund, consisting of deposits by the public service  
13 commission under s. 146.70 (3m) (f) 1.

14          **SECTION 5.** 77.51 (4) (b) 8. of the statutes is created to read:

15          77.51 **(4)** (b) 8. The surcharge established in rules of the public service  
16 commission under s. 146.70 (3m) (f) for customers of wireless providers, as defined  
17 in s. 146.70 (3m) (a) 6.

18          **SECTION 6.** 77.51 (15) (b) 7. of the statutes is created to read:

19          77.51 **(15)** (b) 7. The surcharge established in rules of the public service  
20 commission under s. 146.70 (3m) (f) for customers of wireless providers, as defined  
21 in s. 146.70 (3m) (a) 6.

22          **SECTION 7.** 146.70 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

23          146.70 **(3m)** WIRELESS PROVIDERS. (a) *Definitions.* In this subsection:

24          1. “Commercial mobile radio service provider” has the meaning given in s.  
25 196.01 (2g).

1           2. “Commission” means the public service commission.

2           3. “Federal wireless orders” means the orders of the federal communications  
3 commission regarding 911 emergency services for wireless telephone users in FCC  
4 docket no. 94–102.

5           4. “Local government” means a city, village, town, or county, or an entity formed  
6 by a contract under s. 66.0301 (2) by a city, village, town, or county.

7           5. “Reimbursement period” means the period beginning on the effective date  
8 of this subdivision .... [revisor inserts date], and ending on the last day of the 3–year  
9 period beginning on the first day of the 2nd month beginning after the effective date  
10 of the rules promulgated under par. (f) 1.

11           6. “Wireless provider” means a commercial mobile radio service provider that  
12 is subject to the federal wireless orders.

13           7. “Wireless public safety answering point” means a facility to which a person  
14 dialing the digits “911” on a wireless provider’s system is initially routed for  
15 response, and on which a public agency directly dispatches the appropriate  
16 emergency service provider, relays a message to the appropriate emergency service  
17 provider, transfers the call to the appropriate emergency services provider, or relays  
18 a message or transfers the call to a local government emergency call center that  
19 dispatches the appropriate emergency services provider.

20           (am) *Designated public safety answering points.* A wireless public safety  
21 answering point shall be a designated public safety answering point for the purpose  
22 of implementing the federal wireless orders only if the wireless public safety  
23 answering point is identified in a resolution adopted under par. (c) 3. or 6.

24           (b) *Grant applications; wireless providers.* 1. Except as provided in subd. 2.  
25 and par. (d) 1e., a wireless provider may not receive a grant under par. (d) unless, no

1 later than the first day of the 3rd month beginning after the effective date of the rules  
2 promulgated under par. (d) 4., the wireless provider applies to the commission with  
3 an estimate, and supporting documentation, of the costs that it has incurred, or will  
4 incur, during the reimbursement period to upgrade, purchase, lease, program,  
5 install, test, operate, or maintain all data, hardware, and software necessary to  
6 comply with the federal wireless orders in this state. The estimate may not include,  
7 and a wireless provider may not seek reimbursement for, any such costs that the  
8 wireless provider recovers or has recovered from customers in this state during or  
9 before the reimbursement period for the implementation of wireless 911 emergency  
10 service in this state.

11 2. A wireless provider that does not provide service to customers in this state  
12 prior to the effective date of this subdivision .... [revisor inserts date], may make an  
13 application under subd. 1. after the date specified in subd. 1. pursuant to rules  
14 promulgated by the commission under par. (d) 4.

15 (c) *Grant applications; local governments.* 1. Except as provided in par. (d) 1e.,  
16 a local government that operates a wireless public safety answering point, or local  
17 governments that jointly operate a wireless public safety answering point, may not  
18 receive a grant under par. (d) unless the requirements under subds. 3. to 5. are  
19 satisfied and, no later than the first day of the 3rd month beginning after the effective  
20 date of the rules promulgated under par. (d) 4., every county which itself is one of the  
21 local governments or in which any of the local governments is located applies to the  
22 commission with an estimate, and supporting documentation, of the costs specified  
23 in subd. 1r. and the costs that the local government or local governments have  
24 directly and primarily incurred, or will directly and primarily incur, during the

1 reimbursement period for leasing, purchasing, operating, or maintaining the  
2 wireless public safety answering point, including costs for all of the following:

3 a. Necessary network equipment, computer hardware and software, database  
4 equipment, and radio and telephone equipment, that are located within the wireless  
5 public safety answering point.

6 b. Training operators of a wireless public safety answering point.

7 c. Network costs for delivery of calls from a wireless provider to a wireless  
8 public safety answering point.

9 d. Collection and maintenance of data used by the wireless public safety  
10 answering point, including data to identify a caller and the location of a caller.

11 e. Relaying messages regarding wireless emergency 911 telephone calls via  
12 data communications from the wireless public safety answering point to local  
13 government emergency call centers in operation before June 1, 2003, that dispatch  
14 the appropriate emergency service providers, but only if the rules promulgated  
15 under par. (d) 4. allow for reimbursement of such costs.

16 1m. The estimate under subd. 1. may not include, and a local government may  
17 not seek reimbursement for, any costs described in subd. 1. that the local government  
18 recovers in the form of a gift or grant received by the local government for the  
19 purposes described in subd. 1.

20 1r. An application under subd. 1. may include an estimate of costs directly and  
21 primarily incurred by the local government or local governments between January  
22 1, 1999, and the effective date of this subdivision .... [revisor inserts date], for any of  
23 the costs identified in subd. 1. a. and d.

1           2. If an application under subd. 1. is for the joint operation of a wireless public  
2 safety answering point by local governments, the application shall specify the  
3 manner in which the estimated costs are apportioned among the local governments.

4           3. A local government that operates a wireless public safety answering point,  
5 or local governments that jointly operate a wireless public safety answering point,  
6 are not eligible for grants under par. (d) unless, no later than the first day of the 3rd  
7 month beginning after the effective date of the rules promulgated under par. (d) 4.,  
8 every county which itself is one of the local governments or in which any of the local  
9 governments is located has passed a resolution specifying that the wireless public  
10 safety answering point is eligible for the grants. Except as provided in subd. 4., only  
11 one wireless public safety answering point in each county is eligible for local  
12 governments to receive grants under par. (d).

13           4. If a county or local government in a county jointly operates a wireless public  
14 safety answering point with another county or local government in another county,  
15 the resolution passed by each county under subd. 3. shall specify the same wireless  
16 public safety answering point, and the counties shall submit a joint application  
17 under subd. 1. that complies with the requirement under subd. 2. In each county that  
18 submits a joint application, only the wireless public safety answering point specified  
19 in the resolutions is eligible for local governments to receive grants under par. (d).

20           5. Except as provided in subd. 6. a., a local government that operates, or local  
21 governments that jointly operate, a wireless public safety answering point are not  
22 eligible for grants under par. (d) unless the wireless public safety answering point  
23 serves the entire geographic area of all of the following:

24           a. For each local government that is not a county, each county in which the local  
25 government is located.

1           b. For each local government that is a county, the county itself.

2           6. a. A local government is not required to serve, with its wireless public safety  
3 answering point, the area of a city, village, or town that, by resolution, states its  
4 intention to establish a wireless public safety answering point separate from the  
5 wireless public safety answering point specified in a resolution under subd. 3. passed  
6 by the county in which the city, village, or town is located. A city, village, or town that  
7 adopts a resolution under this subd. 6. a. shall ensure that its entire geographic area  
8 is served by another wireless public safety answering point.

9           b. A city, village, or town that adopts a resolution under subd. 6. a. is not  
10 required to receive wireless 911 emergency service from the wireless public safety  
11 answering point specified in a resolution under subd. 3. passed by the county in  
12 which the city, village, or town is located. A city, village, or town that rescinds a  
13 resolution adopted under subd. 6. a. is required to receive wireless 911 emergency  
14 service from the wireless public safety answering point specified in a resolution  
15 under subd. 3. passed by the county in which the city, village, or town located, unless  
16 the city, village, or town subsequently adopts a new resolution under subd. 6. a.

17           c. A city, village, or town that adopts a resolution under subd. 6. a. shall submit  
18 a copy of the resolution to the county in which it is located and to the commission.

19           (d) *Grants; commission approval and rules.* 1. The commission shall approve  
20 an application under par. (b) or (c) if the commission determines that the costs  
21 estimated in the application are reasonable and have been, or will be, incurred for  
22 the purpose of promoting a cost-effective and efficient statewide system for  
23 responding to wireless emergency 911 telephone calls and, for an application under  
24 par. (c), if the requirements under subd. 1g. are satisfied.

1           1e. If a wireless provider or local government submits an application after the  
2 deadline specified in par. (b) 1. or (c) 1. (intro.), the commission shall reduce the costs  
3 approved under subd. 1. by the following amounts:

4           a. If the application is no more than 1 week late, 5%.

5           b. If the application is 1 week or more but less than 2 weeks late, 10%.

6           c. If the application is 2 weeks or more but less than 4 weeks late, 25%.

7           d. If the application is 4 weeks or more late, the wireless provider or local  
8 government is not eligible for a grant.

9           1g. If an application under par. (c) includes an estimate of costs identified in  
10 par. (c) 1. d. incurred during the reimbursement period or between January 1, 1999,  
11 and the effective date of this subdivision .... [revisor inserts date], the commission  
12 may approve the application only if the commission determines that the local  
13 government's collection of land information, as defined in s. 16.967 (1) (b), and  
14 development of a land information system, as defined in s. 16.967 (1) (c), that is  
15 related to that purpose are consistent with the applicable county land records  
16 modernization plans developed under s. 59.72 (3) (b), conform to the standards on  
17 which such plans are based, and do not duplicate land information collection and  
18 other efforts funded through the land information program under s. 16.967 (7). The  
19 commission shall obtain the advice of the land information board in making  
20 determinations under this subdivision.

21           1r. If the commission does not approve an application under subd. 1., the  
22 commission shall provide the applicant or applicants with the commission's reasons  
23 and give the applicant or applicants an opportunity to resubmit the application.

24           2. From the appropriation under s. 20.155 (3) (q), the commission shall make  
25 grants to reimburse wireless providers and local governments for costs approved



1 under subd. 1. that are actually incurred by the wireless providers and local  
2 governments, except that no wireless provider or local government may receive a  
3 total amount in grants that exceeds the estimated amount approved by the  
4 commission under subd. 1. for that wireless provider or local government. For  
5 applications for the joint operation of a wireless public safety answering point, the  
6 commission shall apportion the grants in the manner specified under par. (c) 2.

7 3. No grant to a local government under subd. 2. may be used to reimburse costs  
8 for any of the following:

9 a. Emergency service dispatch, including personnel, training, equipment,  
10 software, records management, radio communications, and mobile data network  
11 systems.

12 b. Vehicles and equipment in vehicles.

13 c. Communications equipment and software used to communicate with  
14 vehicles.

15 d. Real estate and improvements to real estate, other than improvements  
16 necessary to maintain the security of a wireless public safety answering point.

17 e. Salaries and benefits of operators of a wireless public safety answering point.

18 4. The commission shall promulgate rules establishing requirements and  
19 procedures for making grants under this paragraph, including criteria for approving  
20 estimated costs under subd. 1. The rules shall require the commission to make the  
21 grants during the 3-year period beginning on the first day of the 3rd month  
22 beginning after the effective date of the rules promulgated under par. (f) 1. The rules  
23 shall include record-keeping requirements to ensure that the grants are used to  
24 reimburse estimated costs approved by the commission. The rules shall allow the  
25 commission to make the grants in installments. The rules shall also include

1 requirements for wireless providers specified in par. (b) 2. to apply for grants. The  
2 rules shall specify the conditions under which a wireless provider or local  
3 government may revise an application approved under subd. 1.

4 4m. The rules promulgated under subd. 4. may allow local governments to  
5 receive grants for reimbursement of the costs described in par. (c) 1. e., but only if the  
6 commission collects information regarding the expected amount of such costs and the  
7 commission determines that the expected amount of the costs is no more than 5% of  
8 the overall cost of the statewide system for responding to wireless emergency 911  
9 telephone costs and that reimbursement of such costs is in the public interest,  
10 promotes public health and safety, and is not a disincentive to consolidation of  
11 dispatch functions by local government emergency call centers. If the rules  
12 promulgated under subd. 4. allow for reimbursement of the costs described in par.  
13 (c) 1. e., the commission shall include the information that the commission is  
14 required to collect under this subdivision in the report required for the rules under  
15 s. 227.19 (3).

16 5. To the greatest extent practicable, a local government that receives a grant  
17 under this paragraph shall make all purchases, leases, and service contracts under  
18 the grant through the program under s. 22.07 (3m). If a local government makes a  
19 purchase, lease, or service contract outside the program under s. 22.07 (3m) when  
20 a practicable option for that purchase, lease, or service contract is available at a lower  
21 price under the program under s. 22.07 (3m), the commission shall reduce the  
22 amount of the local government's grant that is related to that purchase, lease, or  
23 service contract to reflect the lower price. If a local government has made a purchase,  
24 lease, or service contract outside the program under s. 22.07 (3m) when a practicable  
25 option for that purchase, lease, or service contract subsequently becomes available

1 at a lower price under the program under s. 22.07 (3m), the commission shall reduce  
2 the amount of the local government's grant that is related to that purchase, lease, or  
3 service contract to reflect the lower price.

4 6. If the commission approves an application under subd. 1., the wireless  
5 provider or a local government that submitted the application may, before the  
6 commission makes a grant award to the wireless provider or local government, revise  
7 the application pursuant to the rules promulgated under subd. 4.

8 (e) *Supplemental grants.* The commission shall promulgate rules for making  
9 supplemental grants from the appropriation under s. 20.155 (3) (q) to counties that  
10 submit joint applications required under par. (c) 4. The rules shall establish the  
11 supplemental grants in amounts that provide an incentive for counties to submit  
12 joint applications. The rules may not impose any limits on the use of a supplemental  
13 grant and shall allow the commission to make the grants in installments.

14 (f) *Wireless surcharge.* 1. The commission shall promulgate rules requiring  
15 each wireless provider to impose the same monthly surcharge for each telephone  
16 number of a customer that has a billable address in this state, except that the rules  
17 shall adjust the amount of the surcharge that is imposed on customers who prepay  
18 for service to ensure that such customers pay an amount that is comparable to the  
19 monthly amount paid by other customers. The rules shall require the surcharge to  
20 be imposed during the 3-year period beginning on the first day of the 2nd month  
21 beginning after the effective date of the rules. The amount of the surcharge shall be  
22 sufficient for the commission to administer and make the grants under par. (d) and  
23 the supplemental grants under par. (e). The rules shall require wireless providers  
24 to pay the surcharge to the commission for deposit in the wireless 911 fund.

1           2. The commission may promulgate rules that increase or decrease the  
2 surcharge, except that the commission may not increase the surcharge more than  
3 once per year and any increase must be uniform statewide.

4           3. A wireless provider shall identify the surcharge on a customer's bill on a  
5 separate line that consists of the words "federal wireless 911 mandate fee."

6           4. The commission may bring an action to collect a surcharge that is not paid  
7 by a customer and the customer's wireless provider is not liable for the unpaid  
8 surcharge.

9           (g) *Confidentiality of information.* The commission shall withhold from public  
10 inspection any information received under this subsection that would aid a  
11 competitor of a wireless provider in competition with the wireless provider.

12           (h) *Other charges prohibited.* No local government or state agency, as defined  
13 in s. 16.375 (1), except the commission, may require a wireless provider to collect or  
14 pay a surcharge or fee related to wireless emergency telephone service.

15           (i) *Commission authority.* Nothing in this section affects the exemption from  
16 commission authority for commercial mobile radio service providers in s. 196.202.

17           (j) *Sunset.* This subsection does not apply after the first day of the 42nd month  
18 beginning after the effective date of the rules promulgated under par. (f) 1.

19           **SECTION 8.** 146.70 (3m) (d) 1g. of the statutes, as created by 2003 Wisconsin Act  
20 .... (this act), is repealed and recreated to read:

21           146.70 **(3m)** (d) 1g. If an application under par. (c) includes an estimate of costs  
22 for the purpose described in par. (c) 1. d., the commission may approve the application  
23 only if the commission determines that the local government's collection of land  
24 information, as defined in s. 16.967 (1) (b), 2001 stats., and development of a land  
25 information system, as defined in s. 16.967 (1) (c), 2001 stats., that is related to that

1 purpose are consistent with the applicable county land records modernization plans  
2 developed under s. 59.72 (3) (b), 2001 stats., conform to the standards on which such  
3 plans are based, and do not duplicate land information collection and other efforts  
4 funded through the land information program under s. 16.967 (7), 2001 stats.

5 **SECTION 9.** 146.70 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

6 146.70 (7) ~~TELECOMMUNICATIONS UTILITY NOT LIABLE~~ LIABILITY EXEMPTION. A  
7 telecommunications utility, wireless provider, as defined in sub. (3m) (a) 6., or local  
8 government, as defined in sub. (3m) (a) 4., shall not be liable to any person who uses  
9 an emergency number system created under this section or makes an emergency  
10 telephone call initially routed to a wireless public safety answering point, as defined  
11 in sub. (3m) (a) 7.

5 **SECTION 12. Nonstatutory provisions.**

6 (1) PROPOSED RULES.

7 (a) *Wireless 911 surcharge rules.* The public service commission shall submit  
8 in proposed form the rules required under section 146.70 (3m) (f) 1. of the statutes,  
9 as created by this act, to the legislative council staff under section 227.15 (1) of the  
10 statutes no later than the 1st day of the 6th month beginning after the effective date  
11 of the rules promulgated under section 146.70 (3m) (d) 4. of the statutes, as created  
12 by this act.

13 (b) *Wireless 911 grant rules.* The public service commission shall submit in  
14 proposed form the rules required under section 146.70 (3m) (d) 4. and (e) of the  
15 statutes, as created by this act, to the legislative council staff under section 227.15  
16 (1) of the statutes no later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the  
17 effective date of this paragraph.

18 **SECTION 13. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the day after publication,  
19 except as follows:

20 (1) SUNSET OF LAND INFORMATION BOARD. The repeal and recreation of section  
21 146.70 (3m) (d) 1g. of the statutes takes effect on July 1, 2005.
