Sen Roessler:

I received the attached email from Deb Sybell and Steve Porter of the State Bar. Based upon their comments, I propose the following: instead of SB 14's Sections 13 & 14, insert:

"Enters another person's real property without that person's consent and looks into any dwelling unit on the property, for the purpose of sexual arousal or gratification and with the intent to intrude upon or interfere with a person's privacy."

Note: I suggest the addition of "real" property in order to eliminate situations involving automobiles, which I believe have been determined to be places with no reasonable expectation of privacy. Based upon your request, I have researched the meaning of "dwelling" and found that as my staff suggested, it can be construed to mean multiple dwelling units. Therefore, the change from "dwelling" to "dwelling" unit.

I have run these corrections and amendments past LRB drafter Mike Dsida.

Note: Mike Dsida will be happy to explain to you how the requirement of consent eliminates the need for Section 14, and the purpose of paragraphs 1 & 2 that he inserted my previous amendment. If you believe that a meeting with Mr. Dsida would be helpful, he has offered to meet with us.
