Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: This bill allows a person who is issued a Class A bear hunting license to transfer that license to a person who is at least 12 years old but under the age of 18. The minor may then use the license to pursue, bait, and hunt bear as authorized by a Class A bear license. The bill allows both residents and nonresidents to transfer Class A bear licensen and allows both resident and non-residents minors to be the transferees. No fee in addition to the original fee paid by the transferor of the license is required except that, if a resident transfers a license to a nonresident minor, the resident must pay a fee equal to the difference between the nonresident and resident license, or \$160. There is no rebate of the fee if a nonresident transfers a license to a resident minor.

Fiscal Estimate: This bill can be implemented without an automated process, which will minimize costs. If transferring a resident to a non-resident, the transferor would submit the \$160 fee (the difference between the \$41 resident and the \$201 nonresident license) up to the bear season through a manual process.

The number of transfers is likely to create only a small workload increase.

The amount of additional revenue to the department will be minimal. The only time the \$160 fee would apply would be when a resident adult transfers a license to a nonresident minor. Only 134 nonresidents purchansed a Class A bear license in license year 2002, and it is unlikely that more than a small handful, if any, of this type would occur.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

If the license fee increase package goes forward the estimates of the resident to nonresident minor transfer fee may increase.
