The bill clearly does **not** obligate UW or, for that matter, any private college, to vaccinate students against meningitis. The only obligations imposed on colleges are to require proof of vaccination before placing a student in student housing or, if the student wants to sign a waiver, to provide detailed information about the risks of the disease and of the availability and effectiveness of vaccines. I do not believe there will be any fiscal impact warranting a fiscal estimate, which is why I did not request one for this bill.

This bill prohibits the University of Wisconsin System and all private colleges and universities in Wisconsin from permitting an undergraduate student to occupy a dormitory or residence hall unless: 1) the student provides proof that he or she has been vaccinated against period meningitic within 12 months of the initial occupancy of the dormitory or residence hall; or 2) the college or university has provided detailed information on the risks associated with botteniol meningitis and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the disease and the student (or his or her parent or guardian, if the student is a minor) affirms that he or she has reviewed the information and has chosen not to be vaccinated.
