

**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 2,
TO 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 344**

June 24, 2003 – Offered by Representatives KREIBICH, UNDERHEIM and SCHNEIDER.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 36.25 (46) and 252.09 of the statutes; **relating to:** requiring
2 college students to be informed about meningococcal disease and hepatitis B
3 and requiring colleges to maintain certain records about the vaccination status
4 of students.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This substitute amendment requires all Wisconsin colleges and universities to provide to all enrolled students each year detailed information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and hepatitis B and the availability and effectiveness of vaccines against the diseases. The colleges and universities must also ensure that each student who resides in on-campus housing affirms that he or she has received the information and, if the student has been vaccinated against either disease, provides the date of the vaccination or vaccinations. Finally, the college or university must maintain a confidential record of the affirmations and the dates of the vaccinations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 36.25 (46) of the statutes is created to read:

1 36.25 **(46)** MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE AND HEPATITIS B. (a) The board shall do all
2 of the following:

3 1. Annually, provide detailed information on the risks associated with
4 meningococcal disease and hepatitis B and the availability and effectiveness of
5 vaccines against the diseases to each enrolled student, if he or she is at least 18 years
6 old, or to the student's parent or guardian, if the student is a minor.

7 2. Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall, or the
8 student's parent or guardian if the student is a minor, to affirm that the student
9 received the information under subd. 1.

10 3. Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm
11 whether he or she has received the vaccination against meningococcal disease and
12 to provide the date of the vaccination, if any.

13 4. Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm
14 whether he or she has received the vaccination against hepatitis B and to provide the
15 date of the vaccination, if any.

16 5. Maintain a confidential record of the affirmations and the dates of the
17 vaccinations of each student under subds. 3. and 4.

18 (b) Nothing in this subsection requires the board to provide or pay for
19 vaccinations against meningococcal disease or hepatitis B.

20 **SECTION 2.** 252.09 of the statutes is created to read:

21 **252.09 Meningococcal disease and hepatitis B. (1)** Each private college
22 and university in this state shall do all of the following:

23 (a) Annually, provide detailed information on the risks associated with
24 meningococcal disease and hepatitis B and the availability and effectiveness of

1 vaccines against the diseases to each enrolled student, if he or she is at least 18 years
2 old, or to the student's parent or guardian, if the student is a minor.

3 (b) Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall, or the
4 student's parent or guardian if the student is a minor, to affirm that the student
5 received the information under par. (a).

6 (c) Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm
7 whether he or she has received the vaccination against meningococcal disease and
8 to provide the date of the vaccination, if any.

9 (d) Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm
10 whether he or she received the vaccination against hepatitis B and to provide the
11 date of the vaccination, if any.

12 (e) Maintain a confidential record of the affirmations and the dates of the
13 vaccinations of each student under pars. (c) and (d).

14 **(2)** Nothing in this section requires a college or university to provide or pay for
15 vaccinations against meningococcal disease or hepatitis B.

16 **SECTION 3. Effective date.**

17 (1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 7th month following publication
18 or on January 1, 2004, whichever is earlier.
