

(3) Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm 7 whether he or she has received the vaccination against meningococcal disease and 8 to provide the date of the vaccination, if any. Require a student who resides in a dormitory or residence hall to affirm whether much he or she received the vaccination against hepatitis B and to provide 11 the date of the vaccination, if any. Maintain a confidential record of the affirmation and the dates of the pars, (c) and (d) vaccinations of each student under sabs 13 Nothing in this section requires a college or university to provide or pay for 15 vaccinations against meningococcal disease or hepatitis B. 16 SECTION 3. Effective date. (1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 7th month following publication 17 18 or on January 1, 2004, whichever is earlier. 19 (END)
