Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: This bill requires every forester who is hired by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) after the effective date of the legislation to have received a bachelor's or higher degree in forestry from a school with a forestry curriculum accredited by the Society of American Foresters or an equivalent degree from a school located in another country. The educational requirements of this bill only apply to newly employed foresters. Current statutes do not require foresters employed by the DNR to satisfy specific educational requirements.

Under current law, before a tree may be cut within the state forests, it must be marked by a forester who is in the professional series of the state classified civil service or by a DNR employee who is equally qualified by having extensive, practical experience designating trees for cutting. Under the bill, the marking must be done either by a forester employed by the DNR or an individual who the DNR determines to be qualified and who would work under the oversight of a DNR forester.

Fiscal Estimate: The proposed changes do not produce a significant fiscal impact.

The present hiring process would be modified to include the forestry degree requirement. Adequate numbers of foresters with appropriate degrees from accredited schools are available to be hired.

With the Department's organization (e.g. a Division of Forestry with the supervision of the forestry staff by foresters), Department foresters provide oversight for the designation of trees that may be cut within the state forests. The proprosed legislation will clarify who may designate trees for harvest and thinning within the state forests; but it will not require a modification to the present process utilized by the Department.
