- 5 66.0501 (5) EMPLOYEES MAY BE CANDIDATES. (a) In this subsection:
  - 1. "Political subdivision" means a city, village, town, or county.
  - 2. "Public employee" means any individual employed by a political subdivision, other than an individual to whom s. 164.06 applies and other than an individual to whom 5 USC 1502 (a) (3) applies.
- 10 (b) No political subdivision may prohibit a public employee from being a 11 candidate for any elective public office, if that individual is otherwise qualified to be

a candidate. No public employee may be required, as a condition of being a candidate
for any elective public office, to take a leave of absence during his or her candidacy.
This subsection does not affect the authority of a political subdivision to regulate the
conduct of a public employee while the public employee is on duty or otherwise acting
in an official capacity.
