Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This legislation would require the Department of Natural Resources to maintain a list of special wastes that are suitable for use in certain public works projects. A special waste when used in a public works project is exempt from regulation as a solid waste if all applicable conditions in the list are met. The most likely wastes that this bill would impact would be foundry sand, coal fly, and bottom ash. The conditions that the Department of Natural Resources would set are those that would prevent environmental contamination from placement of these wastes in the environment.

Fiscal Estimate:

There would be minimal costs to create and maintain the list of special wastes. The list of special wastes would be made available to the public via a web site. The one-time cost to create the website is estimated to be \$700. The total staff time involved in maintaining the website and interacting with interested parties on the use of special wastes would be approximately 40 hours. Assuming an average salary of \$20 per hour, the 40 hours of work would cost \$800, plus the \$318 associated fringe, to total \$1,118. Both the one-time and ongoing expenses could be funded by the Department's current budget.
