

AN ACT /..; relating to: the historic sites operated by the State Historical Society

of Wisconsin and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the State Historical Society of Wisconsin (Historical Society) operates certain historic sites known as Stonefield Village, Pendarvis, Villa Louis, Old Wade House, Madeline Island, Old World Wisconsin, H.H. Bennett Studios, and the First Capitol (historic sites). This bill makes the following changes with respect to the operation of those historic sites:

- 1. The bill permits the Historical Society, subject to authorization by the legislature or the joint committee on finance, to employ outside the classified service sales and development professionals to engage in activities intended to generate admission, sales, and other receipts for the historic sites and to solicit contributions, gifts, grants and bequests in support of the historic sites. The bill also permits the Historical Society to provide a compensation plan for those professionals under which those professionals are compensated, in whole or in part, through commissions and bonuses.
- 2. The bill requires the Department of Employment Relations to study the practices of the Historical Society relating to the hiring, classification, and compensation of the employees, both permanent and limited—term, who staff the historic sites and to recommend changes in those practices to reflect the seasonal nature of the work at the historic sites. The bill specifies that those changes may include the establishment of a separate classification and pay schedule for seasonal employees employed at the historic sites.
- 3. The bill establishes a separate nonlapsible trust fund designated as the Historic Sites Trust Fund consisting of all moneys received from admission, sales,

and other receipts of the historic sites, which may be expended only for the general program operations of the historic sites; all moneys received from contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests made in support of the historic sites, which may be expended only for the purposes for which made or received; and all moneys received by the Historical Society from the sale of memberships in a corporation organized for the purposes of soliciting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests and providing support for the operation, management, and development of a historic site, which must be transferred to the corporation for which the membership was sold.

4. The bill permits the Historical Society to organize and maintain, for each historic site, a nonstock, nonprofit corporation for the purposes of soliciting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests and providing support for the operation, management, and development of the historic site for which the corporation is organized and maintained. The bill requires the Historical Society to organize such a corporation so that contributions to the corporation will be deductible from gross income under the Internal Revenue Code and so that the corporation will be exempt from taxation under that code.

The bill also permits the Historical Society to enter into a contract with a corporation organized for those purposes setting forth the methods by which the Historical Society and the corporation will cooperate to accomplish those purposes. Such a contract shall provide that any contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests accepted by the corporation and not retained by the corporation shall be deposited in the Historic Sites Trust Fund and, in accordance with the wishes of the donor, used exclusively for the operation, management, and development of the historic site for which the corporation was organized.

In addition, the bill permits the Historical Society to sell memberships in a corporation organized for those purposes and requires the Historical Society to deposit all moneys received from the sale of those memberships in the Historic Sites Trust Fund and to transfer those moneys to the corporation for which the membership was sold.

5. The bill requires the Historical Society and the Department of Tourism to enter into a memorandum of understanding setting forth the responsibilities of that department relating to promoting and marketing the historic sites and the methods that the Historical Society and that department will use to cooperate in promoting and marketing the historic sites.

6. Finally, the bill permits the Department of Administration (DOA) to conduct, in cooperation with the Historical Society, a survey of the condition of the facilities and infrastructure of the historic sites and of the Circus World Museum, which is a museum owned by the Historical Society but operated under a lease agreement with the Circus World Museum Foundation, Inc., and to prepare, in cooperation with the Historical Society, a needs assessment for those facilities and that infrastructure that includes a master plan for each of the historic sites and the Circus World Museum designed to achieve a healthy and sustainable historic site system.

As a continuing appropriation, from the historic sites trust fund, all moneys received from admission, sales, and other receipts of the historic sites under s. 44.20 (1), for the general program operations of the historic sites; all moneys received from contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests made in support of the historic sites under s. 44.20 (1), for the purposes for which made or received; and all moneys received from the sale of memberships in a corporation specified in s. 44.20 (3) (b), for transfer to the corporation for which the membership was sold.

SECTION 4. 20.923 (6) (bj) of the statutes is created to read:

SECTION 5. 25.17 (1) (4) of the statutes is created to read:

25.17 (1) (h) Historic sites trust fund (s. 25.74);

SECTION 6. 25.74° of the statutes is created to read:

25.74 Historic sites trust fund. There is established a separate nonlapsible trust fund designated as the historic sites trust fund consisting of all moneys received from admissions, sales, and other receipts of the historic sites under s. 44.20 (1), all moneys received from contribution, gifts, grants, and bequests made in support of those historic sites, and all moneys received from the sale of memberships in a corporation specified in s. 44.20 (3) (b). Moneys in the fund may be expended only as provided in s. 20.245 (1) (r).

SECTION 7. 44.20 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

44.20 (3) (a) For each historic site under sub. (1), the historical society may organize and maintain a nonstock, nonprofit corporation under ch. 181 for the purposes of soliciting and accepting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests and providing support for the operation, management, and development of the historic site for which the corporation is organized and maintained. Any corporation organized under this paragraph shall be organized so that contributions to the corporation will be deductible from gross income under section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code, as defined in s. 71.01 (6), and so that the corporation will be exempt from taxation under section 501 of the Internal Revenue code, as defined in s. 71.22 (4), and s. 71.26 (1) (a).

(b) The historical society may enter into a contract with a corporation organized for the purposes of soliciting and accepting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests

and providing support for the operation, management, and development of a historic site under sub. (1) setting forth the methods by which the historical society and the corporation will cooperate to accomplish those purposes. The contract shall provide that any contribution, gift, grant, or bequest accepted by the corporation and not retained by the corporation shall be deposited in the historic sites trust fund and, in accordance with the wishes of the donor, used exclusively for the operation, management, and development of the historic site for which the corporation was organized.

(c) The historical society may sell memberships in a corporation specified in par. (b). All moneys received from the sale of those memberships shall be deposited in the historic sites trust fund and transferred to the corporation for which the membership was sold.

SECTION 8. 44.20 (4) of the statutes is created to read.

44.20 (4) (a) Subject to authorization under s. 16.505, the historical society may employ outside the classified service sales and development professionals to engage in activities intended to generate admissions, sales, and other receipts for the historic sites under sub. (1) and to solicit contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests in support of those historic sites. The historical society may provide a compensation plan for those professionals under which those professionals are compensated, in whole or in part, through commissions and bonuses.

(b) Notwithstanding s. 230.08 (2) (cd), if a position in the classified service at the historical society is transferred outside the classified service under par. (a) and if the employee holding that position has achieved permanent status in class before the date of that transfer, that employee shall retain, while serving in the unclassified service at the historical society, those protections afforded employees in the classified

service under ss. 230.34 (1) (a) and 230.44 (1) (c) relating to demotion, suspension, discharge, layoff, or reduction in base pay. Such an employee shall also be eligible for transfer under s. 230.29 and shall have reinstatement privileges to the classified service under s. 230.33 (1m). If a position in the classified service at the historical society is transferred outside the classified service under par. (a) and if the employee holding that position has not achieved permanent status in class on the date of that transfer, that employee is eligible to receive the protections, privileges, and rights preserved under this paragraph if the employee successfully completes service equivalent to the probationary period required in the classified service for the position that the employee holds on that date.

SECTION 9. 44.20 (4m) of the statutes is created to read:

44.20 (4m) The historical society and the department of tourism shall enter into a memorandum of understanding setting forth the responsibilities of the department of tourism relating to promoting and marketing the historic sites under sub. (1) and the methods that the historical society and the department of tourism will use to cooperate in promoting and marketing those historic sites.

SECTION 10. 44.20 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

44.20 (5) Annually by December 1, the director of the historical society shall submit a report to the joint committee on finance regarding program revenues and expenditures for each historic site under sub. (1) and on the condition of the historic sites. \checkmark

SECTION 13. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) HISTORIC SITES NEEDS ASSESSMENT. The department of administration may enter into a contract with the historical society under which the department of administration agrees to conduct, in cooperation with the historical society, a survey of the condition of the facilities and infrastructure of the historic sites owned by the historical society and to prepare, in cooperation with the historical society, a needs assessment for the facilities and infrastructure of those sites that includes a master plan for each of those sites designed to achieve a healthy and sustainable historic site system. If the department of administration conducts the survey and needs assessment, it shall submit a report of that survey and needs assessment to the governor, the director of the historical society, and the joint committee on finance, and to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature in the manner provided under section 13.172 (3) of the statutes, by January 1, 2005.

(2) HISTORIC SITE WORKFORCE STUDY. The department of employment relations shall study the practices of the historical society relating to the hiring, classification, and compensation of the employees, both permanent and limited-term, who staff the historic sites operated by the historical society and shall recommend changes in those practices to reflect the seasonal nature of the work at those historic sites. Those changes may include the establishment of a separate classification and pay schedule for seasonal employees employed at the historic sites. The department of employment relations shall submit a report of its study and recommendations to the governor, the secretary of administration, the director of the historical society, and the joint committee on finance, and to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature in the manner provided under section 13.172 (3) of the statutes, by July 1, 2004. deposited in the historic sites



Bennett Studios, and the First Capitol (historic sites). This bill makes the following changes with respect to the operation of those historic sites:

The bill permits the Historical Society, subject to authorization by the legislature or the Joint Committee on Finance, to employ outside the classified service sales and development professionals to engage in activities intended to generate admission, sales, and other receipts for the historic sites and to solicit contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests in support of the historic sites. The bill also permits the Historical Society to provide a compensation plan for those professionals

under which these professionals are compensated, in whole or in part, through commissions and bonuses

The bill requires the Department of Employment Relations to study the practices of the Historical Society relating to the hiring, classification, and compensation of the employees, both permanent and limited—term, who staff the historic sites and to recommend changes in those practices to reflect the seasonal nature of the work at the historic sites. The bill specifies that those changes may include the establishment of a separate classification and pay schedule for seasonal employees employed at the historic sites.

The bill establishes a separate nonlapsible trust fund designated as the history preservation partnership trust fund consisting of all moneys received from admission, sales, and other receipts of the Historical Society, which may be expended only for the general program operations of the Historical Society.

In addition, the bill permits the Historical Society to sell memberships in a corporation organized for those purposes and requires the Historical Society to transfer all moneys received from the sale of those memberships to the corporation for which the membership was sold.

The bill requires the Historical Society and the Department of Tourism to enter into a memorandum of understanding setting forth the responsibilities of that department relating to promoting and marketing the historic sites and the methods that the Historical Society and that department will use to cooperate in promoting and marketing the historic sites.

6. The bill permits the Department of Administration to conduct, in cooperation with the Historical Society, a survey of the condition of the facilities and

infrastructure of the historic sites and of the Circus World Museum, which is a museum owned by the Historical Society but operated under a lease agreement with the Circus World Museum Foundation, Inc., and to prepare, in cooperation with the Historical Society, a needs assessment for those facilities and that infrastructure that includes a master plan for each of the historic sites and the Circus World Museum designed to achieve a healthy and sustainable historic site system.

J. The bill creates a program, to be known as the "History Preservation Partnership Initiative," for the purpose of providing financial support to attract private and federal funds to acquire, construct, develop, enlarge, and improve <u>facilities</u> for collections care, public programs, and visitor services at the historic sites. The bill also creates an appropriation to the Building Commission to finance projects under that initiative, but does not authorize the state to contract any public debt for that purpose.

-8. The bill requires the director of the Historical Society to include in the biennial report that the director is required to submit to the governor and the legislature information regarding revenues and expenditures for each historic site and the condition of the historic sites. Current law requires the director to submit an annual report of that information to the Joint Committee on Finance.

Finally, current law permits the Historical Society to contract with the Wisconsin Fister Foundation, Inc., for the purpose of administering the historical society's membership program. This bill permits the Historical Society to contract with the Wisconsin Foundation, Inc., or any other nonprofit corporation for the purposes of administering the Historical Society's membership program, soliciting and accepting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests for the Historical Society, marketing the historical society's goods and services, providing support for the operation, management, and development of the Historical Society's programs, and performing other functions approved by the board of curators of the Historical Society.

For further information see the state fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the State Historical Society of Wisconsin (Historical Society) operates certain historic sites known as Stoneficld Village, Pendarvis, Villa Louis, Old Wade House, Madeline Island, Old World Wisconsin, H.H. Bennett Studios, and the First Capitol (historic sites). This bill makes the following changes with respect to the operation of those historic sites.

The bill permits the Historical Society, subject to authorization by the legislature or the Joint Committee on Finance, to employ outside the classified service sales and development professionals to engage in activities intended to generate admission, sales, and other receipts for the historic sites and to solicit contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests in support of the historic sites. The bill also permits the Historical Society to provide a compensation plan for those professionals

under which those professionals are compensated, in whole or in part, through commissions and bonuses.

2. The bill requires the Department of Employment Relations to study the practices of the Historical Society relating to the hiring, classification, and compensation of the employees, both permanent and limited—term, who staff the historic sites and to recommend changes in those practices to reflect the seasonal nature of the work at the historic sites. The bill specifies that those changes may include the establishment of a separate classification and pay schedule for seasonal employees employed at the historic sites.

3. The bill establishes a separate nonlapsible trust fund designated as the history preservation partnership trust fund consisting of all moneys received from admission, sales, and other receipts of the Historical Society, which may be expended

only for the general program operations of the Historical Society.

4. The bill permits the Historical Society to organize and maintain, for each historic site, a nonstock, nonprofit corporation for the purposes of soliciting contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests for the historic site for which the corporation is organized and maintained, providing goods or services relating to that historic site, and providing support for the operation, management, and development of that historic site. The bill requires the Historical Society to organize such a corporation so that contributions to the corporation will be deductible from gross income under the Internal Revenue Code and so that the corporation will be exempt from taxation under that code.

The bill also permits the Historical Society to enter into a contract with a corporation organized for those purposes setting forth the methods by which the Historical Society and the corporation will cooperate to accomplish those purposes. Such a contract shall provide that any contributions, gifts, grants, and bequests accepted by the corporation that are not retained by the corporation shall be deposited in the general fund, that any moneys received by the corporation for any goods or services provided by the corporation that are not retained by the corporation shall be deposited in the history preservation partnership fund, and that any contribution, gift, grant, bequest or other moneys so deposited shall be used exclusively, in accordance with the wishes of the donor, for the operation, management, and development of the historic site for which the corporation was organized.

In addition, the bill permits the Historical Society to sell memberships in a corporation organized for those purposes and requires the Historical Society to transfer all moneys received from the sale of those memberships to the corporation

for which the membership was sold.

The bill requires the Historical Society and the Department of Tourism to enter into a memorandum of understanding setting forth the responsibilities of that department relating to promoting and marketing the historic sites and the methods that the Historical Society and that department will use to cooperate in promoting and marketing the historic sites.
