## 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 345

- 1 AN ACT *to create* 14.16 (12) of the statutes; **relating to:** designating the first
- weekend in March Aldo Leopold Weekend.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill directs the governor to proclaim the first full weekend in March each year as Aldo Leopold Weekend. Aldo Leopold was a renowned scientist and conservationist and is widely considered the father of wildlife ecology. He was a professor at the University of Wisconsin for many years and is perhaps best known as the author of *A Sand County Almanac*.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 14.16 (12) of the statutes is created to read:
- 4 14.16 (12) Aldo Leopold Weekend. The governor shall annually proclaim the
- 5 first full weekend in March as Aldo Leopold Weekend to honor the author of A Sand
- 6 County Almanac, an internationally respected scientist and conservationist who is
- 7 widely considered the father of wildlife ecology.
