Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill establishes a Small Business Regulatory Review Board within the Department of Commerce for the purpose of analyzing and reviewing the effects of proposed administrative rules on small businesses. The bill requires agencies to submit to the board any proposed rule that may have a significant impact on small businesses. The bill redefines "small business" and grants a small business the right to seek an injunction against the imposition of a penalty from an action initiated by the small businesses that was the result of erroneous information provided by the agency. The bill further requires every state agency to review all of its administrative rules over the next five years to determine if there are unnecessary burdens placed on small businesses.

The Small Business Regulatory Review Board will consist of 10 members and will meet periodically to determine the effects of proposed administrative rules on small businesses. According to information provided in the "Function of the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse" Report, the Department determined a 10 year statewide average of 199 completed rules per calendar year. The report does not maintain statistics on the number of rules in a given year that adversely affect small businesses. Nonetheless, it is estimated that roughly 30% of completed rules in a given calendar year will have an impact on small businesses, necessitating a hearing. Based on the above estimations, the Department anticipates approximately five rules will necessitate a review each month.

Depending on the complexity of the rules, frequency of submission to the Board and the time necessitated to present and analyze proposed administrative rules, the Department anticipates no fewer than 12 Small Business Regulatory Review Board meetings in a given calendar year. The Department estimates a variety of costs associated with the activities of the Board to include:

Coordinating, scheduling and facilitating meetings: Mailing, printing and material development costs; Telephone and/or videoconferencing: Expense reimbursement; Staff time researching and analyzing proposed rules;

The Department anticipates travel related expenditures only for five of the proposed 10 board members. The Department anticipates the need to reimburse for mileage incurred plus lunch expenses. These costs are estimated below.

The Department estimates that staff time and effort associated with board activities may be absorbed through existing personnel, and the Department will not seek any additional positions to administer the board.
