SECTION 1. 440.03 (13) of the statutes is renumbered 440.03 (13) (a) and amended to read:

440.03 (13) (a) The department may conduct an investigation to determine whether an applicant for a credential issued under chs. 440 to 480 satisfies any of the eligibility requirements specified for the credential, including whether the applicant does not have an arrest or conviction record. In conducting an investigation under this subsection paragraph, the department may require an applicant to provide any information that is necessary for the investigation or, for the

18	fingerprinted on 2 fingerprint cards, each bearing a complete set of the person's
19	fingerprints. The department of justice may submit the fingerprint cards to the
20	federal bureau of investigation for the purpose of verifying the identity of the persons
21	fingerprinted and obtaining records of their criminal arrests and convictions.
22	Section 4. Nonstatutory provisions.
23	(1) The department of regulation and licensing may, using the procedure under
24	section 227.24 of the statutes, promulgate the rules under section 440.03 (13) (b) of
25	the statutes, as created by this act, for the period before permanent rules become

1	effective, but not to exceed the period authorized under section 227.24 (1) (c) and (2)
2	of the statutes. Notwithstanding section 227.24 (1) (a), (2) (b), and (3) of the statutes,
3	the department is not required to provide evidence that promulgating a rule under
4	this subsection as an emergency rule is necessary for the preservation of the public
5	peace, health, safety, or welfare and is not required to provide a finding of emergency
6	for a rule promulgated under this subsection.

SECTION 5. Effective date.

(1) This act takes effect on the first day of the 4th month beginning after publication.
