Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The Department of Justice (DOJ) does not anticipate any additional costs resulting from the passage of this legislation. As proposed, this bill would require applicants for certain credentials to be photographed and fingerprinted. DOJ would be responsible for submitting certain materials to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of verifying the identity of the applicant or credential holder and obtaining his or her records of criminal arrests and convictions.

The Department assumes, for purposes of this estimate, that all standard fees from the Crime Information Bureau (CBI) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) will apply for searches impacted by this legislation. CIB fees are currently \$10 and are proposed to increase in the next biennial budget. The FBI charges \$24 for the processing of fingerprint cards. Typically, these fees are charged to the Department of Regulation and Licensing.
