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

Questions	Woodlands School Fact Sheet
Who is Woodlands School?	Woodlands School, founded by Alverno College in 1936, has been a private school since 1989. We have been chartered by UWM beginning in Fall, 2004.
Is the school only for rich kids?	Not at all. We come from all economic classes and races. In 2002-3, we had 195 students, 46% white, 32% Hispanic, 20% Black, and 2% Native American. 98 students took part in Milwaukee's choice program.
Is it a good school?	You bet. Woodlands graduates have a 99% High School graduation rate. Class size is no more than 20 and most classrooms have a teacher and teacher's aide. State Superintendent Burmaster called Woodlands "an excellent school."
So what's the Problem?	Current state law prohibits non-choice students in grades 4 through 7 from attending a school if it becomes charter. But students in kindergarten through grade three can go.
Does that make sense?	We don't think so. We have several families whose younger children can continue at Woodlands but their older siblings will have to leave. Some students will lose classmates they've been with since kindergarten.
What about suburban kids?	None of them can come back. In all, 26 Suburban and 26 Milwaukee kids, or one in three of our student body, will not be able to attend Woodlands next year.
What will that mean?	We are all very upset at how our school will be disrupted. Our principal is contracting for grief counseling if nothing can be done. We are doing everything we can to keep our diverse student body together.
Can something be done?	Absolutely. AB 261 would solve our problems, but it also deals with much broader issues. If AB 261 doesn't become law we need a bill to "grandfather" in current Woodlands students.
Does anyone support that?	Yes. Reps. Jensen and Sinicki currently are working to ensure that existing students will be able to attend Woodlands School next year. Other Senators and Representatives are supportive of this effort. They hope to have more news about their efforts as soon as possible.
What's the rush?	December is the sign-up period for the new Woodlands charter school. If we don't have the situation resolved by then, affected parents will feel they have no choice but to make sure they get into a different school of their choice.
What do you want?	Support for any legislation that allows current Woodlands students to stay in our school.

Under current law, school boards may enter into contracts with individuals, groups, businesses, or governmental bodies to establish charter schools, which operate with fewer constraints than traditional public schools. 
