At your request, this memorandum describes your proposal to modify the 2004 county and municipal aid distribution, with regard to payments for municipalities.

Relative to current law provisions, the proposal would increase payments for 2004 and thereafter for municipalities where utility aid comprised less than 25% of the 2001 shared revenue payment but more than 75% of the combined payments for 2004 under the shared revenue and county and municipal aid programs.) For each of these municipalities, the per capita reductions authorized under 2001 Wisconsin Act 109 and 2003 Wisconsin Act 33 would be calculated from a 2003 "base-year" payment that includes its entire shared revenue payment and its small municipalities shared revenue payment. Under current law, the utility aid component of the shared revenue program is excluded from the base-year amount. The payment increases resulting from this change would be funded by decreasing payments to other municipalities by a uniform percentage.

Your proposal would increase 2004 payments to two municipalities by an estimated \$282,837. An offsetting decrease, estimated at 0.04%, would be extended to the remaining 1,848 municipalities in the state to fund the payment increases. Under current law provisions, 2003 base year payments are established at \$5,277 for the Town of Quincy (Adams County) and \$83,459 for the Village of Combined Locks (Outagamie County). Your proposal would increase those amounts to \$29,780 for Quincy and \$367,506 for Combined Locks. After the Act 109 and Act 33 payment reductions, 2004 payments would be increased by \$20,660 for Quincy and \$262,177 for Combined Locks. The attached table illustrates the proposed payment calculations.

Under current law, in 2004, generally, each county and municipality receives a county and municipal aid payment that is equal to the amount of shared revenue payments, excluding public utility aid payments, that the county or municipality received in 2003, less certain per capita reductions. Under current law, the amount of the county and municipal aid payment that a county or municipality receives in 2004 is also the amount that the county or municipality receives in 2005 and in each subsequent year.

I have reviewed LRB 4377/P1 and have several comments. When I suggested the remedy for Combined Locks' payment reduction, I had not envisioned the difficulty of drafting language instructing the Department of Revenue (DOR) to calculate the distribution for the Village of Combined Locks and the Town of Quincy first on a "make-believe" basis and then on an actual basis. Your draft avoids that. However, LRB 4377/P1 seems to increase expenditures for the county and municipal aid program by \$282,837. While the draft distributes additional aid to the two identified municipalities, it does not impose a reduction on the remaining 1,848 municipalities to fund the payment increases.

I suggest that the draft be modified by basing the second condition for special treatment on the 2003 aid distribution. This would involve changing "2004" to "2003" on lines 12 and 14 of page 2. Also on line 12, "payment" should be replaced with "entitlement calculated" since municipalities did not receive utility aid payments in 2003. Since aid in 2003 becomes the basis for the second condition, there is no need for the cross-references to the reductions under 2001 Act 109 [s. 79.035 (2) (a) 2.] and 2003 Act 33 [s. 79.043]. Therefore, the phrase reading "including the reductions under subd. 2. and s. 79.043" on line 14 should be deleted.

If these changes are made, DOR will calculate slightly higher per capita reduction rates for the 2004 distribution than will occur under current law. The higher rates will have the effect of "freeing up" \$282,837 for distribution to the Village of Combined Locks and the Town of Quincy. Their payments will be higher because the two reductions will be calculated against 2003 "base" payments that have not been reduced by the amount of their 2003 utility aid entitlements.


