Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary: The Bill allows vehicles currently only certified for use as off-road vehicles to be used on-road when used to collect garbage or refuse. The additional flexibility would apply only to state and local government or contractors working for state or local government.

Fiscal Impact: The bill is permissive, and any state agency or local government units that use this flexibility should not incur any additional costs.

The vehicles being authorized for use are likely to have higher air emissions than vehicles certified for on-road use. Federal standards for off-road vehicles are being tightened, but are on a longer timeline to achieve emission reductions and remain a bit higher than the emission standards that must be met by on-road vehicles.

This bill affects only a very small set of vehicles and is unlikely to result in a substantial increase in emissions in current or potential nonattainment areas.

To the extent that the bill allows a more efficient dispatch of vehicles, overall emissions may actually decrease. There may be fewer total miles of travel if off-road vehicles are allowed to travel on road ways rather than have them hauled by large, and relatively high emitting onroad vehicles.
