#### **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

### **Key Assumptions**

- SB105 would require WisDOT to suspend the driving privilege of any person convicted of making a bomb threat, or carrying or discharging a firearm in a school zone.
- Their is no data available on the number of convictions for these offenses because they represent a very small part of much larger categories of offenses.
- Courts will provide WisDOT with notification of these mandatory convictions. WisDOT will take action based on this information.

#### Conclusion

- No modifications to DMV automated systems.
- Indeterminable ongoing DMV workload impact for processing this type of licensing actions.
- Indeterminable ongoing revenue impact from offenders obtaining occupational licenses and from reinstating their privileges upon eligibility.

#### Basis for Conclusion

- Existing automated systems allow for processing of the automated aspects of licensing actions of these types.
- There is no way of knowing how many individuals are convicted or will be convicted of these offenses. There may be an indeterminable increase in workload from this bill.
- For those cases where WisDOT takes action, there will indeterminable revenue increase from the collection of \$40 occupational license fees and \$50 reinstatement fees.
