348.27 (7m) THREE VEHICLE COMBINATIONS

The department may issue an annual or consecutive month permit for the movement of a 3-vehicle combination consisting of a towing vehicle and, in order by weight, with the lighter of the towed vehicles as the 3rd vehicle in the 3-vehicle combination unless not structurally possible, a mobile home or camping trailer, and a boat trailer, motorcycle trailer, personal watercraft trailer or all terrain vehicle trailer trailer for a vehicle for personal recreational use, to be operated on a highway from April 1 to November 15 of each year, if the overall length.....

This section refers to an "annual permit" - but under this amendment the permits would only be available for April 1 to November 15. Can we still refer to it as an annual permit since it would be for the calendar year? I am assuming that this permit process is really only employed during these months anyway - so I would think the fee etc. could remain the same.

If you think it would make more sense to structure the amended sentence differently - please feel free to do so.
